But *hudud* refers to prescribed punishments (such as amputation and stoning) rather than to laws. While the verse does address antinomianism, Taherzadeh's contextualisation may be overly precise.

K81-96: Kings, nations and lands

K81-83 To the Kings: the Law, lordship, renounces earthly sovereignty. Summarized by Shoghi Effendi in GPB 204. Identical translation in PDC 85.

K83-84 is cited without variation in PDC 71-2.

K84 'the king who will arise'. Mentioned GPB 204, cited 390-1 in relation to Queen Marie (almost identical). Cited with one minor variation in PDC 25 ('is' in first sentence).

K85 'Emperor of Austria'. Translated by Shoghi Effendi in PDC 35-6 and PDC 56 (identical), mentioned GPB 206.

K86 'King of Berlin'. Translated by Shoghi Effendi in PDC 36 and PDC 56 (identical). Shoghi Effendi identifies 'the one whose power transcended thy power' as Napoleon III, GPB 206. Fate described GPB 224.

K87 'We have asked nothing'. Translated by Shoghi Effendi in PDC 26 and partially in PDC 57-8 (identical).

K88 'O Rulers of America'. Translated by Shoghi Effendi in *Citadel of Faith* 18-19; summarized with minor translation differences in GPB 205. GPB 206 treats K85, 86 and 90 also, but without significant differences. GPB 250 and K88 cite, with one phrasing difference.

K89 'O People of Constantinople'. Translated by Shoghi Effendi in PDC 39, 60-1, 97. The texts are identical except that Shoghi Effendi has 'stablished' in all citations, where the 1992 Aqdas edition uses 'established'.

K90 'O banks of the Rhine!'. Translated by Shoghi Effendi in PDC 36, 56 (identical). Mention GPB 206.

K91-93 'Land of Ta'. Gleanings LVI. K91 is cited without variation in PDC 73.

K94 'Land of Kha'. Referred to, but with a slightly different reading of the Arabic, in GPB 213.

K95 'those who wield authority'. GPB 212 interprets as 'strict obedience to one's government'.

K96 'Sprinkle upon the nations'.

K97 Huququllah. TahRB 4 248-56, citing an earlier translation from the compilation on the Huququllah, 10, with many minor changes and the significant variants 'be exposed' in place of 'meet with faithlessness himself' and 'Author of the Preserved tablet' in place of 'in whose possession is the Guarded Tablet'. Taherzadeh cites explanations of this verse from various tablets.
