

3:2 O ETERNAL One, my foes are so many! Many are those who attack me;
3:3 many say of me, "There is no deliverance for him through God."
Selah. aSelah A liturgical direction of uncertain meaning.

3:4 But You, O ETERNAL One, are a shield about me, my glory, who holds my head high.
3:5 I cry aloud to GOD, who answers me from the holy mountain. Selah.
3:6 I lie down and sleep and wake again, for GOD sustains me.
3:7 I have no fear of the myriad forces arrayed against me on every side.
3:8 Rise, O ETERNAL One! Deliver me, O my God! For You slap all my enemies in the face; bface Lit. "cheek." You break the teeth of the wicked.
3:9 Deliverance is GOD's; Your blessing be upon Your people! Selah.

4:1 For the leader; with instrumental music. aFor the leader; with instrumental music Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A psalm of David.
4:2 Answer me when I call, O God, my vindicator! You freed me from distress; have mercy on me and hear my prayer.
4:3 You who side against me, bwho side against me Or "high and mighty ones," or "people"; force of Heb. uncertain. how long will my glory be mocked, will you love illusions, have recourse to frauds? Selah.
4:4 Know that GOD keeps the faithful close; GOD hears when I call out.
4:5 So tremble, and sin no more; ponder it on your bed, and sigh. csigh In contrast to others "be still." Selah.
4:6 Offer sacrifices in righteousness and trust in GOD.
4:7 Many say, "O for good days!" Bestow Your favor on us, dBestow Your favor on us Lit. "Lift up the light of Your countenance upon us"; cf. Num. 6.25–26. O ETERNAL One.
4:8 You put joy into my heart when their grain and wine show increase.
4:9 Safe and sound, I lie down and sleep, for You alone, O ETERNAL One, keep me secure. efor You alone, O ETERNAL ONE, keep me secure Or "for You, O ETERNAL ONE, keep me alone and secure."

5:1 For the leader; on nehiloth. aFor the leader; on nehiloth Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A psalm of David.
5:2 Give ear to my speech, O ETERNAL One; consider my utterance.
5:3 Heed the sound of my cry, my Sovereign and God, for I pray to You.
5:4 Hear my voice, O ETERNAL One, at daybreak; at daybreak I plead before You, and wait.
5:5 For You are not a God who desires wickedness; evil cannot abide with You;
5:6 the wanton cannot endure in Your sight. You detest all evildoers;
5:7 You doom those who speak lies; deceitful murderers GOD abhors.
5:8 But I, through Your abundant love, enter Your house; I bow down in awe at Your holy temple.
5:9 O ETERNAL One, lead me along Your righteous [path] blead me along Your righteous [path] Or "as You are righteous, lead me." because of my watchful foes; make Your way straight before me.
5:10 For there is no sincerity on their lips; clips Lit. "mouth." their heart is [filled with] malice; their throat is an open grave; their tongue slippery.
5:11 Condemn them, O God; let them fall by their own devices; cast them out for

their many crimes,for they defy You.

5:12 But let all who take refuge in You rejoice,ever jubilant as You shelter them;and let those who love Your name exult in You.

5:13 For You surely bless the righteous, O ETERNAL One,encompassing them with favor like a shield.

6:1 For the leader; with instrumental music on the sheminith.aFor the leader; with instrumental music on the sheminith Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A psalm of David.

6:2 O ETERNAL One, do not punish me in anger,do not chastise me in fury.

6:3 Have mercy on me, O ETERNAL One, for I languish;heal me, O ETERNAL One, for my bones shake with terror.

6:4 My whole being is stricken with terror,while You, ETERNAL One—O, how long!

6:5 O ETERNAL One, turn! Rescue me!Deliver me as befits Your faithfulness.

6:6 For there is no praise of You among the dead;in Sheol, who can acclaim You?

6:7 I am weary with groaning;every night I drench my bed,I melt my couch in tears.

6:8 My eyes are wasted by vexation,worn out because of all my foes.

6:9 Away from me, all you evildoers,for GOD heeds the sound of my weeping.

6:10 GOD heeds my plea, GOD accepts my prayer.

6:11 All my enemies will be frustrated and stricken with terror;they will turn back in an instant, frustrated.

7:1 Shiggaion of David,aShiggaion of David Meaning of Heb. uncertain. which he sang to GOD, concerning Cush, a Benjaminite.

7:2 O my ETERNAL God, in You I seek refuge;deliver me from all my pursuers and save me,

7:3 lest, like a lion, they tear me apart,rending in pieces, and no one save me.

7:4 O my ETERNAL God, if I have done such things,if my hands bear the guilt of wrongdoing,

7:5 if I have dealt evil to my ally—I who rescued my foe without rewardbI who rescued my foe without reward Meaning of Heb. uncertain; in contrast to others “or stripped my foe clean.”—

7:6 then let the enemy pursue and overtake me;let my life be trampled to the ground,and my body dwell in the dust. Selah.

7:7 Rise, O ETERNAL One, in Your anger;assert Yourself against the fury of my foes;against the fury of my foes Or “in Your fury against my foes.” bestir Yourself in my behalf;You have ordained judgment.

7:8 dMeaning of verse uncertain. Let the assembly of peoples gather about You,with You enthroned above, on high.

7:9 GOD judges the peoples;vindicate me, O ETERNAL One,for the righteousness and blamelessness that are mine.

7:10 Let the evil of the wicked come to an end,but establish the righteous;the One who probes the mind and conscienceeconscience Lit. “kidneys.” is God the Righteous.

7:11 I look to God to shield me;fI look to God to shield me Cf. Ibn Ezra and Kimhi; lit. “My Shield is upon God.” the deliverer of the upright.

7:12 God vindicates the righteous; God pronounces doom; God pronounces doom. In contrast to others “has indignation.” each day.

7:13 If someone [wicked] does not turn back, but whets his sword, bends his bow and aims it,

7:14 then against himself he readies deadly weapons, and makes his arrows sharp. Meaning of these verses uncertain. Or, with God as the main subject:

“If one does not turn back, [God] whets a sword, / bends a bow and aims it—

/ 14 preparing deadly weapons for him, / and making the arrows sharp.”

7:15 See, he hatches evil, conceives mischief, and gives birth to fraud.

7:16 He has dug a pit and deepened it, and will fall into the trap he made.

7:17 His mischief will recoil upon his own head; his lawlessness will come down upon his skull.

7:18 I will praise GOD for being righteous, and sing a hymn to the name of GOD Most High.

8:1 For the leader; on the gittith. a For the leader; on the gittith. Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A psalm of David.

8:2 O ETERNAL One, our Sovereign, how majestic is Your name throughout the earth—You who have covered the heavens with Your splendor! b You who have covered the heavens with Your splendor. Meaning of Heb. uncertain; or “You whose splendor is celebrated all over the heavens!”

8:3 c Meaning of verse uncertain. From the mouths of infants and sucklings You have founded strength on account of Your foes, to put an end to enemy and avenger.

8:4 When I behold Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and stars that You set in place,

8:5 what are human beings that You have been mindful of them, mortals that You have taken note of them,

8:6 that You have made them little less than divine, divine. Or “the angels.” and adorned them with glory and majesty?

8:7 You have made them master over Your handiwork, laying the world at their feet—

8:8 sheep and oxen, all of them, and wild beasts, too;

8:9 the birds of the heavens, the fish of the sea, whatever travels the paths of the seas.

8:10 O ETERNAL One, our Sovereign, how majestic is Your name throughout the earth!

9:1 For the leader; ‘almuth labben. a For the leader; ‘almuth labben. Meaning of Heb. uncertain; some mss. and ancient versions, ‘al muth labben, as though “over the death of the son.” A psalm of David.

9:2 I will praise You, ETERNAL One, with all my heart; I will tell all Your wonders.

9:3 I will rejoice and exult in You, singing a hymn to Your name, O Most High.

9:4 When my enemies retreat, they stumble to their doom at Your presence.

9:5 For You uphold my right and claim, enthroned as righteous judge.

9:6 You blast the nations; You destroy the wicked; You blot out their name forever.

9:7 b Meaning of verse uncertain. The enemy is no more—ruins everlasting; You

have torn down their cities;their very names are lost.

9:8 But GOD, whose throne is set up for judgment, abides forever;

9:9 it is [God] who judges the world with righteousness,rules the peoples with equity.

9:10 GOD is a haven for the oppressed,a haven in times of trouble.

9:11 Those who know Your name trust You,for You do not abandon those who turn to You, O ETERNAL One.

9:12 Sing a hymn to the ETERNAL, who reigns in Zion;cwho reigns in Zion Or “O You who dwell in Zion.” declare God’s deeds among the peoples.

9:13 For [God] does not ignore the cry of the afflicted;the One who requites bloodshed is mindful of them.dClauses transposed for clarity.

9:14 Have mercy on me, O ETERNAL One;see my affliction at the hands of my foes,You who lift me from the gates of death,

9:15 so that in the gates of Fair ZionFair Zion Lit. “the Daughter of Zion.” I might tell all Your praise,I might exult in Your deliverance.

9:16 The nations sink in the pit they have made;their own foot is caught in the net they have hidden.

9:17 GOD is known,having worked judgment;the wicked are snared by their own devices. Higgsaion.fHiggsaion Meaning of Heb. uncertain. Selah.

9:18 Let the wicked begbe In contrast to others “return to.” in Sheol,all the nations who ignore God!

9:19 Not always shall the needy be ignored,nor the hope of the afflicted forever lost.

9:20 Rise, O ETERNAL One!Let not mortals have power;let the nations be judged in Your presence.

9:21 Strike fear into them,hStrike fear into them Meaning of Heb. uncertain. O ETERNAL One;let the nations know they are only mortals. Selah.

10:1 Why, O ETERNAL One, do You stand aloof,heedless in times of trouble?

10:2 The wicked in their arrogance hound the lowly—may they be caught in the schemes they devise!amay they be caught in the schemes they devise Or “they (i.e., the lowly) are caught by the schemes they devised.”

10:3 The wicked crow about their unbridled lusts;the grasping revile and scorn GOD.

10:4 The wicked, arrogant as they are,in all their scheming [think],bThe wicked crow ... their scheming [think] Meaning of Heb. uncertain. “God does not carecGod does not care Lit. “There is no God.” and does not call to account.”dClauses transposed for clarity.

10:5 Their ways prosper at all times;Your judgments are far beyond them;they snort at all their foes.

10:6 Such people think, “I shall not be shaken,through all time never be in trouble.”

10:7 Their mouth is full of oaths, deceit, and fraud;mischief and evil are under their tongue.

10:8 They lurk in outlying places;from a covert they slay the innocent;their eyes spy out the hapless.

10:9 They wait in a covert like a lion in a lair;wait to seize the lowly;they seize the lowly as they pull their net shut;

10:10 they stoop, they crouch, and the hapless fall prey to their might. and the hapless fall prey to their might Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

10:11 They think, "God is not mindful, the divine face is hidden and never looks."

10:12 Rise, O ETERNAL One! Strike at them, fStrike at them Lit. "Lift Your hand." O God! Do not forget the lowly.

10:13 Why should the wicked scorn God, thinking You do not call to account?

10:14 You do look! You take note of mischief and vexation! To requite is in Your power. gTo requite is in Your power Meaning of Heb. uncertain. To You the hapless can entrust themselves; You have ever been the orphans' help.

10:15 O break the power of the wicked and evildoers, so that when You look forthlook for A play on darash, which in vv. 4 and 13 means "to call to account." their wickedness You will find it no more.

10:16 GOD is sovereign for ever and ever; the nations will perish from this is this Heb. "His." land.

10:17 You will listen to the entreaty of the lowly, O ETERNAL One, You will make their hearts firm; You will incline Your ear

10:18 to champion the orphan and the downtrodden, that mere earthly mortals tyrannize no more. jthat mere earthly mortals tyrannize no more Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

11:1 For the leader. Of David. In GOD I take refuge; how can you say to me, "Take to the hills like a bird! the hills like a bird Meaning of Heb. uncertain; lit. "your hill, bird!"

11:2 For see, the wicked bend the bow, they set their arrow on the string to shoot from the shadows at the upright.

11:3 When the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" bWhen the foundations are destroyed, / what can the righteous do? Or "For the foundations are destroyed; what has the Righteous One done?" Or "If the foundations are destroyed, what have the righteous accomplished?"

11:4 GOD is in the divine holy palace; GOD—whose throne is in heaven, whose eyes behold, whose gaze searches humankind.

11:5 GOD seeks out someone righteous, but loathes the wicked one who loves injustice.

11:6 [God] will rain down upon the wicked blazing coals and sulfur; a scorching wind shall be their lot. ctheir lot Lit. "the portion of their cup."

11:7 For GOD is righteous, and loves righteous deeds; the upright shall behold God's face.

12:1 For the leader; on the sheminith. A psalm of David.

12:2 Help, O ETERNAL One! For the faithful are no more; the loyal have vanished from among mortals.

12:3 People speak lies to one another; their speech is smooth; they talk with duplicity.

12:4 May GOD cut off all flattering lips, every tongue that speaks arrogance.

12:5 They say, "By our tongues we shall prevail; with lips such as ours, who can be our master?"

12:6 "Because of the groans of the plundered poor and needy, I will now act," says GOD. "I will give help," [God] affirms to them. a "I will give

help,” [God] affirms to them Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

12:7 GOD’s words are pure words,silver purged in an earthen crucible,refined sevenfold.

12:8 You, O ETERNAL One, will keep them,guarding each from this agebfrom this age Meaning of Heb. uncertain. evermore.

12:9 On every side the wicked roamwhen baseness is exalted among mortals.cwhen baseness is exalted among mortals Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

13:1 For the leader. A psalm of David.

13:2 How long, O ETERNAL One; will You ignore me forever?How long will You hide Your face from me?

13:3 How long will I have cares on my mind,grief in my heart all day?How long will my enemy have the upper hand?

13:4 Look at me, answer me, O my ETERNAL God!Restore the luster to my eyes,lest I sleep the sleep of death;

13:5 lest my enemy say, “I have overcome him,”my foes exult when I totter.

13:6 But I trust in Your faithfulness,my heart will exult in Your deliverance.I will sing to GOD,who has been good to me.

14:1 aCf. Psalm 53. For the leader. Of David.The scoundrel thinks,“God does not care.”bGod does not care Lit. “There is no God”; cf. 10.4.

HumanHuman Heb. “Their.” deeds are corrupt and loathsome;no one does good.

14:2 GOD looks down from heaven on humankindto find someone with understanding,someone mindful of God.

14:3 All have turned bad,altogether foul;there is no one who does good,not even one.

14:4 Are they so witless, all those evildoers,who devour my people as they devour food,and do not invoke GOD?

14:5 There they will be seized with fright,for God is present in the circle of the righteous.

14:6 You may set at naught the counsel of the lowly,but GOD is their refuge.

14:7 O that the deliverance of Israel might come from Zion!When GOD restores the fortunes of this covenanted people,Jacob will exult, Israel will rejoice.

15:1 A psalm of David. GOD, who may sojourn in Your tent,who may dwell on Your holy mountain?

15:2 Anyone who lives without blame,who does what is right,and in their heart acknowledges the truth;

15:3 whose tongue is not given to evil;awhose tongue is not given to evil Meaning of Heb. uncertain; or “who has no slander upon the tongue.” who has never done harm to a compatriot,or borne reproach for [acts toward] a neighbor;

15:4 for whom someone contemptible is abhorrent,but who honors those who fear GOD;who keeps an oath even when it hurts;

15:5 who has never lent money at interest,or accepted a bribe against the innocent.One who acts thus shall never be shaken.

16:1 A michtamamichtam Meaning of Heb. uncertain. of David.Protect me, O God, for I seek refuge in You.

16:2 I say to GOD,“You are my Sovereign, my benefactor;there is none above You.”bmy benefactor; / there is none above You In contrast to others “I have no good but in You.”

16:3 As to the holy and mighty ones that are in the land, my whole desire concerning them is that

16:4 those who espouse another [god] may have many sorrows! cAs to the holy and mighty ones ... sorrows Meaning of Heb. uncertain; "holy and mighty ones" taken as epithets for divine beings; cf. qedoshim in Ps. 89.6, 8, and 'addirim in 1 Sam. 4.8. I will have no part of their bloody libations; their names will not pass my lips.

16:5 GOD is my allotted share and portion; dportion Lit. "cup." You control my fate.

16:6 Delightful country has fallen to my lot; lovely indeed is my estate.

16:7 I bless GOD who has guided me; my conscience e conscience Lit. "kidneys." admonishes me at night.

16:8 I am ever mindful of GOD's presence—who is at my right hand; I shall never be shaken.

16:9 So my heart rejoices, my whole being exults, and my body rests secure.

16:10 For You will not abandon me to Sheol, or let Your faithful one see the Pit.

16:11 You will teach me the path of life. In Your presence is perfect joy; delights are ever in Your right hand.

17:1 A prayer of David. Hear, O ETERNAL One, what is just; heed my cry, give ear to my prayer, uttered without guile.

17:2 My vindication will come from You; Your eyes will behold what is right.

17:3 You have visited me at night, probed my mind, You have tested me and found nothing amiss; I determined that my mouth should not transgress.

17:4 As for mortals' dealings, in accord with the command of Your lips, aI determined ... lips Meaning of Heb. uncertain. I have kept in view the fate b fate Cf. Prov. 1.19; lit. "paths." of the lawless.

17:5 My feet have held to Your paths; my legs have not given way.

17:6 I call on You; You will answer me, God; turn Your ear to me, hear what I say.

17:7 Display Your faithfulness in wondrous deeds, You who deliver with Your right hand those who seek refuge from assailants.

17:8 Guard me like the apple of Your eye; hide me in the shadow of Your wings

17:9 from the wicked who despoil me, my mortal enemies who c my mortal enemies who Or "from my enemies who avidly." encircle me.

17:10 Their hearts are closed to pity; d Their hearts are closed to pity Meaning of Heb. uncertain. they mouth arrogance;

17:11 now they hem in our feet on every side; they set their eyes roaming over the land.

17:12 They are e They are Heb. "He is." like a lion eager for prey, a king of beasts lying in wait.

17:13 Rise, O ETERNAL One! Go forth to meet my enemies. f my enemies Heb. "him." Bring them down; rescue me from the wicked with Your sword,

17:14 from mortals, O ETERNAL One, with Your hand, from mortals whose share in life is fleeting. But as to Your treasured ones, fill their bellies. g from

mortals, O ETERNAL ONE, ... fill their bellies Meaning of Heb. uncertain. Their children too shall be satisfied, and have something to leave over for their young.

17:15 Then I, justified, will behold Your face;awake, I am filled with the vision of You.

18:1 aThis poem occurs again at 2 Sam. 22, with a number of variations, some of which are cited in the following notes. For the leader. Of David, the servant of GOD, who addressed the words of this song to GOD after GOD had saved him from the hands of all his enemies and from the clutches of Saul.

18:2 He said:I adore you, O ETERNAL One, my strength,bI adore you, O ETERNAL ONE, my strength Not in 2 Sam. 22.2.

18:3 O ETERNAL One, my crag, my fortress, my deliverer,my God, my rock in which I take shelter,my shield, my mighty champion,cmighty champion Lit. “horn of rescue.” my haven.

18:4 All praise! I called on GODdAll praise! I called on GOD Construction of Heb. uncertain. and was delivered from my enemies.

18:5 RopesRopes Cf. 2 Sam. 22.5 “breakers.” of Death encompassed me;torrents of BelialfBelial I.e., the netherworld, like “Death” and “Sheol.” terrified me;

18:6 ropes of Sheol encircled me;snare of Death confronted me.

18:7 In my anguish I called on the ETERNAL,cried out to my God,who from a heavenly abodeg heavenly abode Lit. “His temple”; cf. v. 10. heard my voice,whose ears received my cry.

18:8 Then the earth rocked and quaked;the foundations of the mountains shook—rocked by divine indignation;

18:9 smoke went up from God’s nostrils,devouring fire from God’s mouth—live coals blazing forth.

18:10 [God] bent the sky and came down,thick cloud beneath divine feet.

18:11 [God] mounted a cherub and flew,gliding on the wings of the wind.

18:12 [God] made darkness a screen—pavilions of dark thunderheads,dense clouds of the sky all around.

18:13 In the divine brilliance,hail and fiery coals pierced those clouds.hpierced those clouds Cf. 2 Sam. 22.13 “blazed.”

18:14 Then GOD thundered from heaven,the Most High gave forth voice—hail and fiery coalsihail and fiery coals Not in 2 Sam. 22.14.—

18:15 letting shafts fly, and scattering them;discharging lightning, and routing them.

18:16 The ocean bed was exposed;the foundations of the world were laid bareby Your mighty roaring, O ETERNAL One,at the blast of Your breath.jYour breath Lit. “the breath of Your nostrils.”

18:17 Reaching down from on high, [God] took me,drawing me out of the mighty waters—

18:18 rescuing me from my fierce enemy,from foes too strong for me.

18:19 They confronted me on the day of my calamity,but GOD was my support—

18:20 bringing me out to freedom,pleased with me enough to rescue me.

18:21 GOD rewarded me according to my merit—requiting the cleanness of my hands—

18:22 for I have kept to the ways of GOD and have not been guilty before my God;

18:23 for I am mindful of all God’s rulesand have not disregarded God’s

laws.

18:24 I have been blameless toward [God],and have guarded myself against sinning;

18:25 and GOD has requited my merit,according to the evident cleanness of my hands.

18:26 With the loyal, You deal loyally;with the blameless,kthe blameless Heb. “blameless man.” blamelessly.

18:27 With the pure, You act purely,and with the perverse, You are wily.

18:28 It is You who deliver lowly folk,but haughty eyes You humble.

18:29 It is You who light my lamp;my ETERNAL God lights up my darkness.

18:30 With You, I can rush a barrier;lbarrier Cf. note to 2 Sam. 22.30; or “troop.” with my God, I can scale a wall.

18:31 The way of God is perfect;the word of the ETERNAL is pure.[God] shields all who seek refuge.

18:32 Truly, who is a god except the ETERNAL,who is a rock but our God?—

18:33 the God who girded me with might,who made my way secure;

18:34 who made my legs like a deer’s,and set me firmly on themthe Taking bamothai as a poetic form of bamoth; cf. Hab. 3.19; in contrast to others “my.” heights;

18:35 who trained my hands for battle—my arms can bend a bow of bronze!

18:36 You have granted me the shield of Your protection;Your right hand has sustained me,Your carecare Meaning of Heb. uncertain; in contrast to others “condescension.” has made me great.

18:37 You have let me stride on freely;my feet have not slipped.

18:38 I pursued my enemies and overtook them;I did not turn back till I destroyed them.

18:39 I struck them down,and they could rise no more;they lay at my feet.

18:40 You have girded me with strength for battle,brought low my adversaries before me,

18:41 made my enemies turn tail before me;I wiped out my foes.

18:42 They cried out, but there was none to deliver;to GOD, who did not answer them.

18:43 I ground them fine as windswept dust;I trod them flat like dirt of the streets.

18:44 You have rescued me from the strife of people;You have set me at the head of nations;peoples I knew not must serve me.

18:45 At the mere report of me they are submissive;foreign peoples cower before me.

18:46 Foreign peoples lose courage,and come trembling out of their strongholds.oand come trembling out of their strongholds Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

18:47 GOD lives! Blessed is my rock!Exalted be God, my deliverer,

18:48 the God who has vindicated meand made peoples subject to me,

18:49 who rescued me from my enemies,who raised me clear of my adversaries,saved me from the lawless opposition!

18:50 For this I sing Your praise among the nations, ETERNAL One,and hymn Your name:

18:51 According great victoriespAccording great victories Cf. 2 Sam. 22.51,
“Tower of victory.” to YourqYour Heb. 3rd person. king,keeping faith with
YourrYour See preceding note. anointed,with David and his offspring evermore.

19:1 For the leader. A psalm of David.

19:2 The heavens declare the glory of God,the sky proclaims God’s handiwork.

19:3 Day to day makes utterance,night to night speaks out.

19:4 There is no utterance,there are no words,whose sound goes unheard.awhose
sound goes unheard With Septuagint, Symmachus, and Vulgate; or “their sound
is not heard.”

19:5 TheirbTheir Namely, of the heavens. voicecvoice Cf. Septuagint, Symmachus,
and Vulgate; Arabic qawwah, “to shout.” carries throughout the earth,their
words to the end of the world.[God] placed in them a tent for the sun,

19:6 who is like a groom coming forth from the chamber,like a hero, eager to
run his course.

19:7 His rising-place is at one end of heaven,and his circuit reaches the

19:10 The fear of GOD is pure,abiding forever;the judgments of GOD are
true,righteous altogether,

19:11 more desirable than gold,than much fine gold;sweeter than honey,than
drippings of the comb.

19:12 Your servant pays them heed;in obeying them there is much reward.

19:13 Who can be aware of errors?Clear me of unperceived guilt,

19:14 and from willful sinsdwillful sins Or “the arrogant”; cf. 119.51.

keep Your servant;let them not dominate me;then shall I be blamelessand clear
of grave offense.

19:15 May the words of my mouthand the prayer of my hearteheart For leb as a
source of speech, see note to Eccl. 5.1. be acceptable to You,O ETERNAL One, my
rock and my redeemer.

20:1 For the leader. A psalm of David.

20:2 May GOD answer you in time of trouble,the name of Jacob’s God keep you
safe—

20:3 sending you help from the sanctuary,and sustaining you from Zion.

20:4 May [God] receive the tokensareceive the tokens Cf. ’azkarah, “token
portion” of grain offering; Lev. 2.2, 9, 16, etc. of all your grain
offerings,and approveapprove Meaning of Heb. uncertain. your burnt offerings.
Selah.

20:5 May your desire be granted,your every plan fulfilled.

21:13 For You make them turn back b For You make them turn back Meaning of Heb. uncertain. by Your bows aimed at their face.

21:14 Be exalted, O ETERNAL One, through Your strength; we will sing and chant the praises of Your mighty deeds.

22:1 For the leader; on ayyeleth ha-shahar. a ayyeleth ha-shahar Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A psalm of David.

22:2 My God, my God, why have You abandoned me; why so far from delivering me and from my anguished roaring?

22:3 My God, I cry by day—You answer not; by night, and have no respite.

22:4 But You are the Holy One, enthroned, the Praise of Israel. b But You are the Holy One, / enthroned, / the Praise of Israel Or “But You are holy, enthroned upon the praises of Israel.”

22:5 In You our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and You rescued them.

22:6 To You they cried out and they escaped; in You they trusted and were not disappointed.

22:7 But I am a worm, less than human; less than human Or “inconsequential.” scorned by everyone, despised by people.

22:8 All who see me mock me; they curl their lips, d they curl their lips Lit. “they open wide with a lip.” they shake their heads.

22:9 “Let him commit himself to GOD; let [God] rescue him, let [God] save him, for [God] is pleased with him.”

22:10 You drew me from the womb, made me secure at my mother's breast.

22:11 I became Your charge at birth; from my mother's womb You have been my God.

22:12 Do not be far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.

22:13 Many bulls surround me, mighty ones of Bashan encircle me.

22:14 They open their mouths at me like tearing, roaring lions.

22:15 My life ebbs away: My life ebbs away Lit. "I am poured out like water." all my bones are disjointed; my heart is like wax, melting within me;

22:16 my vigor dries up like a shard; my tongue cleaves to my palate; You commit me to the dust of death.

22:17 Dogs surround me; a pack of evil ones closes in on me, like lions [they maul] my hands and feet. Like lions [they maul] my hands and feet With Rashi; cf. Isa. 38.13.

22:18 I take the count of all my bones while they look on and gloat.

22:19 They divide my clothes among themselves, casting lots for my garments.

22:20 But You, O ETERNAL One, be not far off; my strength, hasten to my aid.

22:21 Save my life from the sword, my precious life precious life Lit. "only one." from the clutches of a dog.

22:22 Deliver me from a lion's mouth; from the horns of wild oxen rescue me Lit. "answer." me.

22:23 Then will I proclaim Your fame to my kin, praise You in the congregation.

22:24 You who fear GOD, give praise! All you offspring of Jacob, show honor! Be in dread, all you offspring of Israel!

22:25 For [God] did not scorn, and did not spurn, the plea Or "plight." of anyone lowly; [God] did not turn away turn away Lit. "hide His face." from them; when they cried out, [God] listened.

22:26 Because of You I offer praise! Because of You I offer praise Lit. "From You is my praise." in the great congregation; I pay my vows in the presence of God's worshipers.

22:27 Let the lowly eat and be satisfied; let all who seek GOD give praise. Always be of good cheer!

22:28 Let all the ends of the earth pay heed and turn to GOD, and the peoples of all nations prostrate themselves before You;

22:29 for sovereignty is GOD's, who rules the nations.

22:30 mMeaning of verse uncertain; in contrast to others "All the fat ones of the earth shall eat and worship; / All they that go down to the dust shall kneel before Him, / Even he that cannot keep his soul alive." All those in full vigor shall eat and prostrate themselves; all those at death's door, whose spirits flag, shall bend the knee in submission.

23:4 Though I walk through a valley of deepest darkness, a valley of deepest darkness. In contrast to others “the valley of the shadow of death.” I fear no harm, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff—they comfort me.

23:5 You spread a table for me in full view of my enemies; You anoint my head with oil; my drink is abundant.

23:6 Only goodness and steadfast love shall pursue me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in GOD’s house for many long years.

24:1 Of David. A psalm. The earth is GOD’s and all that it holds, the world and its inhabitants.

24:2 For [God] founded it upon the ocean, set it on the nether-streams.

24:3 Who may ascend GOD’s mountain? Who may stand in that holy place?—

24:6 Such is the circle Lit. “generation.” of those who turn to You, c You Heb. 3rd person. Jacob, who seek Your presence. Selah.

24:7 O gates, lift up your heads! Up high, you everlasting doors, so the Kingd King I.e., the One who leads the celestial army. of glory may come in!

24:8 Who is the King of glory?—GOD, mighty and valiant, GOD, valiant in battle.

24:9 O gates, lift up your heads! Lift them up, you everlasting doors, so the King of glory may come in!

24:10 Who is the King of glory?—GOD of Hosts is truly the King of glory! Selah.

25:1 Of David. ? O ETERNAL One, I set my hope on You;

25:2 ? my God, in You I trust; may I not be disappointed, may my enemies not exult over me.

25:3 ? O let no one who looks to You be disappointed; let the faithless be disappointed, empty-handed.

25:4 ? Let me know Your paths, O ETERNAL One; teach me Your ways;

25:5 ? ? guide me in Your true way and teach me, for You are God, my deliverer; it is You I look to at all times.

25:6 ? O ETERNAL One, be mindful of Your compassion and Your faithfulness; they are old as time.

25:7 ? Be not mindful of my youthful sins and transgressions; in keeping with Your faithfulness consider what is in my favor, as befits Your goodness, O ETERNAL One.

25:8 ? Good and upright is GOD, who shows sinners the way.

25:9 ? [God] guides the lowly in the right path, and teaches the lowly the godly way.

25:10 ? All GOD’s paths are steadfast love for those who keep the decrees of the covenant.

25:17 ? My deep distress My deep distress Lit. "The distress of my heart." increases; deliver me from my straits.

25:18 ? Look at my affliction and suffering, and forgive all my sins.

25:19 See how numerous my enemies are, and how unjustly they hate me!

25:20 ? Protect me and save me; let me not be disappointed, for I have sought refuge in You.

25:21 ? May integrity and uprightness watch over me, for I look to You.

25:22 O God, redeem Israel from all its distress.

26:1 Of David. Vindicate me, O ETERNAL One, for I have walked without blame; I have trusted in GOD; I have not faltered.

26:2 Probe me, O ETERNAL One, and try me, test my heart and mind; a heart and mind Lit. "kidneys and heart."

26:3 for my eyes are on Your steadfast love; I have set my course by it. for my eyes are on Your steadfast love; / I have set my course by it Or "I am aware of Your faithfulness, and always walk in Your true [path]."

26:4 I do not consort with scoundrels, or mix with hypocrites;

26:11 But I walk without blame; redeem me, have mercy on me!

26:12 My feet are on level ground. In assemblies I will bless GOD.

27:1 Of David. GOD is my light and my help; whom should I fear? GOD is the stronghold of my life, whom should I dread?

27:2 When evildoers assail me to devour my flesh to devour my flesh Or "to slander me"; cf. Dan. 3.8; 6.25.—it is they, my foes and my enemies, who stumble and fall.

27:3 Should an army besiege me, my heart would have no fear; should war beset me, still would I be confident.

27:10 Though my father and mother abandon me, GOD will take me in.

27:11 Show me Your way, O ETERNAL One, and lead me on a level path because of my watchful foes.

27:12 Do not subject me to the will of my foes, for false witnesses and unjust accusers have appeared against me.

27:13 Had I not the assurance that I would enjoy GOD's goodness in the land of the living...

27:14 Look to GOD; be strong and of good courage! O look to GOD!

28:1 Of David. O ETERNAL One, I call to You; my rock, do not disregard me, for if You hold aloof from me, I shall be like those gone down into the Pit.

28:2 Listen to my plea for mercy when I cry out to You, when I lift my hand toward Your inner sanctuary.

28:3 Do not count me out Or "drag me off"; meaning of Heb. uncertain. with the wicked and evildoers who profess goodwill toward their fellows while malice is in their heart.

28:4 Pay them according to their deeds, their malicious acts; according to their handiwork pay them, give them their deserts.

28:5 For they do not consider GOD's deeds, the work of divine hands. May [God] tear them down, never to rebuild them!

28:6 Blessed is GOD, who listens to my plea for mercy.

28:7 GOD is my strength and my shield, the One in whom my heart trusts. I was helped, helped Or "strengthened." and my heart exulted, so I will give glory with my song.

28:8 GOD is their strength; their strength Septuagint, Saadia, and others render, and some mss. read, 'oz le'ammo, "the strength of God's people." and a stronghold for the deliverance of our anointed ruler. our anointed ruler Heb. "His anointed one."

28:9 Deliver and bless Your very own people; tend them and sustain them forever.

29:1 A psalm of David. Ascribe to GOD, O divine beings, ascribe to GOD glory and strength.

29:2 Ascribe to GOD the glory of that name; bow down to GOD, majestic in holiness.

29:3 GOD's voice is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, GOD, over the mighty waters.

29:4 The voice of GOD is power; GOD's voice is majesty;

29:5 GOD's voice breaks cedars; GOD shatters the cedars of Lebanon—

29:6 making Lebanon skip like a calf, making Lebanon skip like a calf Lit. "makes them skip like a calf, Lebanon and Sirion...." Sirion, like a young wild ox.

29:7 GOD's voice kindles flames of fire;

29:8 GOD's voice convulses the wilderness; GOD convulses the wilderness of Kadesh;

29:9 GOD's voice causes hinds to calve, and strips forests bare; and strips forests bare Or "brings ewes to early birth." while in the divine temple all say "Glory!"

29:10 GOD sat enthroned at the Flood; GOD sits enthroned, ruler forever.

29:11 May strength be granted to GOD's people; may GOD bless this people with well-being.

30:1 A psalm of David. A song for the dedication of the House. at the House I.e., the temple.

30:2 I extol You, O ETERNAL One, for You have lifted me up, and not let my enemies rejoice over me.

30:3 O my ETERNAL God, I cried out to You, and You healed me.

30:4 O ETERNAL One, You brought me up from Sheol, preserved me from going down into the Pit.

30:5 O you faithful of GOD, sing out, and praise that holy name.

30:6 For [God] is angry but a moment, and when pleased, there is life. One may lie down weeping at nightfall; b One may lie down weeping at nightfall Or "Weeping may linger for the night." but at dawn there are shouts of joy.

30:11 Hear, O ETERNAL One, and have mercy on me; O ETERNAL One, be my help!"

30:12 You turned my lament into dancing, you undid my sackcloth and girded me with joy,

30:13 that [my] whole being might sing hymns to You endlessly; O my ETERNAL God, I will praise You forever.

31:1 For the leader. A psalm of David.

31:2 I seek refuge in You, O ETERNAL One; may I never be disappointed; as You are righteous, rescue me.

31:3 Incline Your ear to me; be quick to save me; be a rock, a stronghold for me, a citadel, for my deliverance.

31:4 For You are my rock and my fortress; You lead me and guide me as befits Your name.

31:5 You free me from the net laid for me, for You are my stronghold.

31:6 Into Your hand I entrust my spirit; You redeem me, O ETERNAL One, faithful God.

31:7 I detest those who rely on empty folly, but I trust in GOD.

31:8 Let me exult and rejoice in Your faithfulness when You notice my affliction, are mindful of my deep distress,

31:13 I am put out of mind like the dead;I am like an object given up for lost.

31:15 But I trust in You, O ETERNAL One;I say, “You are my God!”

33:14 From God's dwelling-place the divine gaze toucheson all the inhabitants of the earth—

33:15 the One who fashions the hearts of them all,who discerns all their doings.

33:16 Kings are not delivered by a large force;warriors are not saved by great strength;

33:17 horses are a false hope for deliverance;for all their great power they provide no escape.

33:18 Truly GOD's eye is on those who show reverence,who wait for God's faithful care

33:19 to save them from death,to sustain them in famine.

33:20 We set our hope on GOD,who is our help and shield;

33:21 in whom our hearts rejoice,in whose holy name we trust.

33:22 May we enjoy, O ETERNAL One, Your faithful care,as we have put our hope in You.

34:1 Of David, when he feigned madness in the presence of Abimelech, who turned him out, and he left.awhen he feigned madness ... and he left Cf. 1 Sam.

34:2 ? I bless GOD at all times;praise is ever in my mouth.

35:10 All my bones shall say,“ETERNAL One, who is like You?You save a pauper from someone stronger,a needy pauper from a despoiler.”

35:11 Malicious witnesses appearwho question me about things I do not know.

35:12 They repay me evil for good,[seeking] my bereavement.

35:13 Yet, when they were ill,my dress was sackcloth,I kept a fast—may what I prayed for happen to me!bmay what I prayed for happen to me Meaning of Heb. uncertain; lit. “my prayer returns upon my bosom.”

35:14 I walked about as though it were my friend or my kin;I was bowed with gloom, like one mourning for a mother.

35:15 But when I stumble, they gleefully gather;wretches gather against me,I know not why;they tear at me without end.

35:16 With impious, mocking grimace they tear ... grimace Meaning of Heb. uncertain. they gnash their teeth at me.

35:17 O my Sovereign, how long will You look on?Rescue me from their attacks,dfrom their attacks Meaning of Heb. uncertain. my precious life, from the lions,

35:18 that I may praise You in a great congregation,acclaim You in a mighty throng.

35:19 Let not my treacherous enemies rejoice over me,or those who hate me without reason wink their eyes.

35:20 For they do not offer amity,but devise fraudulent schemes against harmless folk.

35:21 They open wide their mouths at me,saying, “Aha, aha, we have seen it!”

35:22 You have seen it, O ETERNAL One;do not hold aloof!O my Sovereign, be not far from me!

35:23 Wake, rouse Yourself for my cause,for my claim, O my God and my Sovereign!

35:24 Take up my cause, O my ETERNAL God, as You are beneficent,and let them not rejoice over me.

35:25 Let them not think,“Aha, just what we wished!”Let them not say,“We have destroyed him!”

35:26 May those who rejoice at my misfortunebe frustrated and utterly disgraced;may those who vaunt themselves over mebe clad in frustration and shame.

35:27 May those who desire my vindicationsing forth joyously;may they always say,“Extolled be GOD who desires the well-being of one who renders service,”

35:28 while my tongue shall recite Your beneficent acts,Your praises all day long.

36:1 For the leader. Of the servant of GOD, of David.

36:2 I knowI know Lit. “In my heart is.” what Transgression says to the wicked;they have no sense of the dread of God,

36:3 because its speech is seductive to themtill their iniquity be found out and they be hated.bMeaning of verse uncertain.

36:4 Their words are evil and deceitful;they will not consider doing good.

36:5 In bed they plot mischief;they are set on a path of no good,they do not reject evil.

36:6 O ETERNAL One, Your faithfulness reaches to heaven;Your steadfastness to the sky;

36:7 Your beneficence is like the high mountains;Your justice like the great deep;human and animal You deliver, O ETERNAL One.

36:8 How precious is Your faithful care, O God!Humankind shelters in the shadow of Your wings.

36:9 They feast on the rich fare of Your house;You let them drink at Your refreshing stream.

36:10 With You is the fountain of life;by Your light do we see light.

36:11 Bestow Your faithful care on those devoted to You,and Your beneficence on the upright.

36:12 Let not the foot of the arrogant tread on me,or the hand of the wicked drive me away.

36:13 There lie the evildoers, fallen,thrust down, unable to rise.

37:1 Of David. ? Do not be vexed by evildoers;do not be incensed by wrongdoers;

37:2 for they soon wither like grass,like verdure fade away.

37:3 ? Trust in GOD and do good,abide in the land and remain loyal.

37:4 Seek GOD's favor,and you will be granted the desires of your heart.

37:5 ? Leave allaall Lit. "your way." to GOD;be trusting; [God] will do it—

37:6 causing your vindication to shine forth like the light,the justice of your case, like the noonday sun.

37:7 ? Be patient and wait for GOD,do not be vexed by the one who is prospering—the opponent who carries out schemes.

37:8 ? Give up anger, abandon fury,do not be vexed;it can only do harm.

37:9 For evildoers will be cut off,but those who look to GOD—they shall inherit the land.

37:10 ? A little longer and there will be no wicked;you will look at where they were—they will be gone.

37:11 But the lowly shall inherit the land,and delight in abundant well-being.

37:12 ? The wicked scheme against the righteous,and gnash their teeth at them.

37:13 My Sovereign laughs at them,knowing that their day will come.

37:14 ? The wicked draw their swords, bend their bows,to bring down the lowly and needy,to slaughter the upright.bthe upright Lit. "those whose way is upright."

37:15 Their swords shall pierce their own hearts,and their bows shall be broken.

37:16 ? Better the little that a righteous person has than the great abundance of the wicked.

37:17 For the arms of the wicked shall be broken,but GOD is the support of the righteous.

37:18 ? GOD is concerned for the needsneeds Lit. "days." of the blameless;their portion lasts forever;

37:19 they shall not come to grief in bad times;in famine, they shall eat their fill.

37:20 ? But the wicked shall perish,and GOD's enemies shall be consumed,like meadow grassmeadow grass Meaning of Heb. uncertain. consumed in smoke.

37:21 ? The wicked borrow and do not repay;the righteous are generous and keep

giving.

37:22 Those blessed by [God] shall inherit the land, but those who are cursed shall be cut off.

37:23 ? People's steps People's steps Or "[Even] the steps of virile men." are made firm by GOD, when their way is a delight to [God].

37:24 Though they stumble, they do not fall down, for GOD gives them support.

37:25 ? I have been young and am now old, but I have never seen someone righteous abandoned, or their children seeking bread.

37:26 They are always generous, and lend, and their children are held blessed.

37:27 ? Shun evil and do good, and you shall abide forever.

37:28 For GOD loves what is right, and does not abandon those who are faithful. They are preserved forever, while the children of the wicked will be cut off.

37:29 The righteous shall inherit the land, and abide forever in it.

37:30 ? The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, and their tongue speaks what is right.

37:31 The teaching of their God is in their heart; their feet do not slip.

37:32 ? The wicked watch for the righteous, seeking to put them to death;

37:33 GOD will not abandon them to their power, and will not let them be condemned in judgment.

37:34 ? Look to GOD and keep to the godly way, and you will be raised high that you may inherit the land; when the wicked are cut off, you shall see it.

37:35 ? I saw the wicked, powerful, well-rooted like a robust native tree.

37:36 Suddenly they vanished and were gone; I sought them, but they were not to be found.

37:37 ? Mark the blameless, note the upright, for there is a future for the person of integrity.

37:38 But transgressors shall be utterly destroyed, the future of the wicked shall be cut off.

37:39 ? The deliverance of the righteous comes from GOD, their stronghold in time of trouble.

37:40 GOD helps them and rescues them, rescues them from the wicked and delivers them, for in [God] they seek refuge.

38:1 A psalm of David. Lehaazkir. aLehaazkir Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

38:2 O ETERNAL One, do not punish me in wrath; do not chastise me in fury.

38:3 For Your arrows have struck me; Your blows have fallen upon me.

38:4 There is no soundness in my flesh because of Your rage, no wholeness in my bones because of my sin.

38:5 For my iniquities have overwhelmed me; boverwhelmed me Lit. "passed over my head." they are like a heavy burden, more than I can bear.

38:6 My wounds stink and fester because of my folly.

38:7 I am all bent and bowed; I walk about in gloom all day long.

38:8 For my sinews are full of fever; there is no soundness in my flesh.

38:9 I am all benumbed and crushed; I roar because of the turmoil in my mind.

38:10 O my Sovereign, You are aware of all my entreaties; my groaning is not hidden from You.

38:11 My mind reels; my strength fails me; my eyes too have lost their luster.

38:12 My friends and companions stand back from my affliction;my kin stand far off.

38:13 Those who seek my life lay traps;those who wish me harm speak malice;they utter deceit all the time.

38:14 But I am like the deaf, unhearing,like the mute who cannot speak up;

38:15 I am like one who does not hear,whose mouth has no retort.

38:16 But I wait for You, O ETERNAL One;You will answer, O my Sovereign, my God.

38:17 For I fear they will rejoice over me;when my foot gives way they will vaunt themselves against me.

38:18 For I am on the verge of collapse;my pain is always with me.

38:19 I acknowledge my iniquity;I am fearful over my sin;

38:20 for my mortal enemies are numerous;my treacherous foes are many.

38:21 Those who repay evil for goodharass me for pursuing good.

38:22 Do not abandon me, O ETERNAL One;my God, be not far from me;

38:23 hasten to my aid,O my Sovereign, my deliverance.

39:1 For the leader; for Jeduthun. A psalm of David.

39:2 I resolved I would watch my steplest I offend by my speech;I would keep my mouth muzzledwhile the villain was in my presence.

39:3 I was dumb, silent;I was veryavery Cf. use of twb in Hos. 10.1; Jonah 4.4. stillwhile my pain was intense.

39:4 My mind was in a rage,my thoughts were all aflame;I spoke out:

39:5 Tell me, O ETERNAL One, what my term is,what is the measure of my days;I would know how fleeting my life is.

39:6 You have made my life just handbreadths long;its span is as nothing in Your sight;no human endures any longer than a breath.bno human endures any longer than a breath Meaning of Heb. uncertain. Selah.

39:7 Everyone walks about as a mere shadow;mere futility is their hustle and bustle,amassing and not knowing who will gather in.

39:8 What, then, can I count on, O my Sovereign?In You my hope lies.

39:9 Deliver me from all my transgressions;make me not the butt of the benighted.

39:10 I am dumb, I do not speak up,for it is Your doing.

39:11 Take away Your plague from me;I perish from Your blows.

39:12 You chastise everyone in punishment for sin,consuming like a moth what they treasure.No human is more than a breath. Selah.

39:13 Hear my prayer, O ETERNAL One;give ear to my cry;do not disregard my tears;for like all my forebearsI am an alien, resident with You.

39:14 Look away from me, that I may recover,cthat I may recover Meaning of Heb. uncertain. before I pass away and am gone.

40:1 For the leader. A psalm of David.

40:2 I put my hope in GOD,who inclined toward me,and heeded my cry.

40:3 I was lifted out of the miry pit,the slimy clay,and my feet were set on a rock,my legs steadied.

40:4 A new song was placed into my mouth,a hymn to our God.May many see it and stand in awe,and trust in GOD.

40:5 Happy is the oneathe one Or “a virile man.” who trusts in GOD,who

turns not to the arrogant or to followers of falsehood.

40:6 You, O my ETERNAL God, have done many things; the wonders You have devised for us cannot be set out before You; b You, O my ETERNAL God, have done many things; / the wonders You have devised for us / cannot be set out before You Or “You, O my ETERNAL God, have done many things— / the wonders You have devised for us; / none can equal You.” I would rehearse the tale of them, but they are more than can be told.

40:7 You gave me to understand that c You gave me to understand that Meaning of Heb. uncertain. You do not desire sacrifice and grain offering; You do not ask for burnt offering and purgation offering.

40:12 O ETERNAL One, You will not withhold from me Your compassion; Your steadfast love will protect me always.

40:13 For misfortunes without number envelop me; my iniquities have caught up with me; I cannot see; they are more than the hairs of my head; I am at my wits’ end. e I am at my wits’ end Or “my courage fails me.”

40:14 f Cf. Psalm 70. O favor me, ETERNAL One, and save me; O ETERNAL One, hasten to my aid.

40:15 Let those who seek to destroy my life be frustrated and disgraced; let those who wish me harm fall back in shame.

40:16 Let those who say “Aha! Aha!” over me be desolate because of their frustration.

40:17 But let all who seek You be glad and rejoice in You; let those who are eager for Your deliverance always say, “Extolled be GOD!”

40:18 But I am poor and needy; may my Sovereign devise [deliverance] for me. You are my help and my rescuer; my God, do not delay.

41:1 For the leader. A psalm of David.

41:2 Happy is someone who is thoughtful of the wretched; in bad times may GOD keep them a them I.e., the thoughtful person. from harm.

41:3 May GOD guard them and preserve them; and may they be thought happy in the land. Do not subject them to the will of their enemies.

41:4 GOD will sustain them on their sickbed; You shall wholly transform their bed of suffering. b You shall wholly transform their bed of suffering Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

41:5 I said, “O ETERNAL One, have mercy on me, heal me, for I have sinned against You.”

41:6 My enemies speak evilly of me, “When will he die and his name perish?”

41:7 Each of them who comes to visit speaks falsely, storing up evil

thoughts—speaking them once outside.

41:8 All my enemies whisper together against me, imagining the worst for me.

41:9 “Something baneful has settled in him; he’ll not rise from his bed again.”

41:10 My ally in whom I trusted, even someone who shares my bread, has been utterly false to me. has been utterly false to me Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

41:11 But You, O ETERNAL One, have mercy on me; let me rise again and repay them.

41:12 Then shall I know that You are pleased with me: when my enemy cannot shout in triumph over me.

41:13 You will support me because of my integrity, and let me abide in Your presence forever.

41:14 Blessed is the ETERNAL, God of Israel, from eternity to eternity. Amen and Amen.

42:1 For the leader. A maskil of the Korahites.

42:2 Like a hind crying for water, a water Lit. “watercourses.” my soul cries for You, O God;

42:3 my soul Or “throat.” thirsts for God, the living God; O when will I come to appear before God!

42:4 My tears have been my food day and night; I am ever taunted with, “Where is your God?”

42:5 When I think of this, I pour out my soul: how I walked with the crowd, moved with them, walked with the crowd, moved with them Meaning of Heb. uncertain. the festive throng, to the House of God with joyous shouts of praise.

42:6 Why so downcast, my soul, why disquieted within me? Have hope in God; I will yet give praise for God’s saving presence. for God’s saving presence Several ancient versions and Heb. mss. connect the end of this verse with the first word in v. 7, reading yeshu’ot panai we-’Elohai, “my ever-present help, my God,” as in v. 12 and 43.5.

42:10 I say to God, my rock, “Why have You forgotten me, why must I walk in gloom, oppressed by my enemy?”

42:11 Crushing my bones, f Crushing my bones Meaning of Heb. uncertain. my foes revile me, taunting me always with, “Where is your God?”

42:12 Why so downcast, my soul, why disquieted within me? Have hope in God; I will yet give praise, my ever-present help, my God.

43:1 a A continuation of Psalm 42. Vindicate me, O God, champion my cause against faithless people; rescue me from treacherous, dishonest opponents.

43:2 For You are my God, my stronghold; why have You rejected me? Why must I walk in gloom, oppressed by the enemy?

43:3 Send forth Your light and Your truth; they will lead me; they will bring me to Your holy mountain, to Your dwelling-place,

43:4 that I may come to the altar of God, God, my delight, my joy; that I may praise You with the lyre, O God, my God.

43:5 Why so downcast, my soul, why disquieted within me? Have hope in God; I will yet give praise, my ever-present help, my God.

44:1 For the leader. Of the Korahites. A maskil.

44:2 We have heard, O God, our ancestors have told us the deeds You performed in their time, in days of old.

44:3 With Your hand You planted them, displacing nations; You brought misfortune on peoples, and drove them out.

44:4 It was not by their sword that they took the land, their arm did not give them victory, but Your right hand, Your arm, and Your goodwill, for You favored them.

44:5 You are my king, a king See note at 24.7. O God; decree victories for Jacob!

44:6 Through You we gore our foes; by Your name we trample our adversaries;

44:7 I do not trust in my bow; it is not my sword that gives me victory;

44:8 You give us victory over our foes; You thwart those who hate us.

44:9 In God we glory at all times, and praise Your name unceasingly. Selah.

44:10 Yet You have rejected and disgraced us; You do not go with our armies.

44:11 You make us retreat before our foe; our enemies plunder us at will.

44:12 You let them devour us like sheep; You disperse us among the nations.

44:13 You sell Your people for no fortune, You set no high price on them.

44:14 You make us the butt of our neighbors, the scorn and derision of those around us.

44:15 You make us a byword among the nations, a laughingstock, a laughingstock Lit. "wagging of the head." among the peoples.

44:16 I am always aware of my disgrace; I am wholly covered with shame

44:17 at the sound of taunting revilers, in the presence of the vengeful foe.

44:18 All this has come upon us, yet we have not forgotten You, or been false to Your covenant.

44:19 Our hearts have not gone astray, nor have our feet swerved from Your path,

44:20 though You cast us, crushed, to where the sea monster, sea monster Heb. tannim = tannin, as in Ezek. 29.3; 32.2. is, and covered us over with deepest darkness.

44:21 If we forgot the name of our God and spread forth our hands to a foreign god,

44:22 God would surely search it out, as the One who knows the secrets of the heart.

44:23 It is for Your sake that we are slain all day long, that we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.

44:24 Rouse Yourself; why do You sleep, O my Sovereign? Awaken, do not reject us forever!

44:25 Why do You hide Your face, ignoring our affliction and distress?

44:26 We lie prostrate in the dust; our body clings to the ground.

44:27 Arise and help us, redeem us, as befits Your faithfulness.

45:1 For the leader; on shoshannim. ashoshannim Meaning of Heb. uncertain. Of the Korahites. A maskil. A love song.

45:2 My heart is astir with gracious words; I speak my poem to a king; my tongue

is the pen of an expert scribe.

45:3 You are fairer than all mortals; your speech is endowed with grace; rightly has God given you an eternal blessing.

45:4 Gird your sword upon your thigh, O hero, in your splendor and glory;

45:5 b Meaning of verse uncertain. in your glory, win success; ride on in the cause of truth and meekness and right; and let your right hand lead you to awesome deeds.

45:6 Your arrows, sharpened, [pierce] the breast of the king's enemies; peoples fall at your feet. c [pierce] the breast of the king's enemies; / peoples fall at your feet Clauses transposed for clarity.

45:7 Your divine throne divine throne Cf. 1 Chron. 29.23. is everlasting; your royal scepter is a scepter of equity.

45:8 You love righteousness and hate wickedness; rightly has God, your God, chosen to anoint you with oil of gladness over all your peers.

45:9 All your robes [are fragrant] with myrrh and aloes and cassia; from ivory palaces lutes entertain you.

45:10 Royal princesses are your favorites; the consort stands at your right hand, decked in gold of Ophir.

45:11 Take heed, lass, and note, incline your ear: forget your people and your father's house,

45:12 and let the king be aroused by your beauty; since he is your lord, bow to him.

45:13 O Tyrian lass, the wealthiest people will court your favor with gifts,

45:14 goods of all sorts. The royal princess, her dress embroidered with golden mountings,

45:15 is led inside to the king; e goods of all sorts ... to the king Meaning of Heb. uncertain. maidens in her train, her companions, are presented to you.

45:16 They are led in with joy and gladness; they enter the palace of the king.

45:17 Your sons will succeed your fathers; you will appoint them princes throughout the land.

45:18 I commemorate your fame for all generations, so peoples will praise you forever and ever.

46:1 For the leader. Of the Korahites; alamothe. aalamoth Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A song.

46:2 God is our refuge and stronghold, a help in trouble, very near.

46:3 Therefore we are not afraid though the earth reels, though mountains topple into the sea—

46:4 its waters rage and foam; in its swell mountains quake. Selah.

46:5 There is a river whose streams gladden God's city, the holy dwelling-place of the Most High.

46:6 God is in its midst, it will not be toppled; by daybreak God will come to its aid.

46:7 Nations rage, kingdoms topple; at the sound of God's thunder the earth dissolves.

46:8 GOD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our haven. Selah.

46:9 Come and see what GOD has done, how devastation has been wrought on the earth.

46:10 [God] puts a stop to wars throughout the earth, breaking the bow, snapping the spear, consigning wagons to the flames.

46:11 “Desist! Realize that I am God! I dominate the nations; I dominate the earth.”

46:12 GOD of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our haven. Selah.

47:1 For the leader. Of the Korahites. A psalm.

47:2 All you peoples, clap your hands, raise a joyous shout for God.

47:3 For GOD Most High is awesome, great ruler over all the earth,

47:4 who subjects peoples to us, sets nations at our feet.

47:5 [God] chose our heritage for us, the pride of Jacob the beloved. Selah.

47:6 God ascends midst acclamation; the ETERNAL, to the blasts of the horn.

47:7 Sing, O sing to God; sing, O sing to our sovereign;

47:8 for God is ruler over all the earth; sing a hymn. a hymn Heb. maskil, a musical term of uncertain meaning.

47:9 God reigns over the nations; God is seated on the holy throne.

47:10 The great of the peoples are gathered together, the retinue of Abraham’s God; for the guardians of the earth belong to God, who is greatly exalted.

48:1 A song. A psalm of the Korahites.

48:2 GOD is great and much acclaimed in the city of our God, the holy mountain—

48:3 fair-crested, joy of all the earth, Mount Zion, summit of Zaphon, a Zaphon A term for the divine abode. city of the great ruler.

48:4 Through its citadels, God has become known as a haven.

48:5 See, the kings joined forces; they advanced together.

48:6 At the mere sight of it they were stunned, they were terrified, they panicked;

48:7 they were seized there with a trembling, like a woman in the throes of labor,

48:8 as the Tarshish fleet was wrecked in an easterly gale. as the Tarshish fleet ... gale See 1 Kings 22.49.

48:9 The likes of what we heard we have now witnessed in the city of GOD of hosts, in the city of our God—may God preserve it forever! Selah.

48:10 In Your temple, God, we meditate upon Your faithful care.

48:11 The praise of You, God, like Your name, reaches to the ends of the earth; Your right hand is filled with beneficence.

48:12 Let Mount Zion rejoice! Let the towns towns Or “women.” of Judah exult, because of Your judgments.

48:13 Walk around Zion, circle it; count its towers,

48:14 take note of its ramparts; go through go through Meaning of Heb. uncertain. its citadels, that you may recount it to a future age.

48:15 For God truly is our God forever, who will lead us evermore. evermore Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

49:1 For the leader. Of the Korahites. A psalm.

49:2 Hear this, all you peoples; give ear, all inhabitants of the world,

49:3 both low and high, rich and poor alike.

49:4 My mouth utters wisdom, my speech my speech Lit. “utterance of my heart”; on leb, cf. 19.15. is full of insight.

49:5 I will turn my attention to a theme, set forth my lesson to the music of a

lyre.

49:6 In time of trouble, why should I fear the encompassing evil of those who would supplant me—

49:7 those who trust in their riches, who glory in their great wealth?

49:8 Ah, it is Ah, it is Or “A brother.” cannot redeem anyone, or pay one’s ransom to God;

49:9 the price of life is too high; and so one ceases to be, forever.

49:10 Shall anyone live eternally, and never see the grave?

49:11 For one sees that the wise die, that the foolish and ignorant both perish, leaving their wealth to others.

49:12 Their grave Their grave Heb. qirbam, taken with ancient versions and medieval commentators as the equivalent of qibram. is their eternal home, the dwelling-place for all generations of those once famous on earth.

49:13 Mortals do not abide in honor; they are like the beasts that perish.

49:14 Such is the fate of those who are self-confident, the end of those pleased with their own talk. the end of those pleased with their own talk Meaning of Heb. uncertain. Selah.

49:15 Sheeplike they head for Sheol, with Death as their shepherd. The upright shall rule over them at daybreak, and their form shall waste away in Sheol till its nobility be gone. and their form ... gone Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

49:16 But God will redeem my life from the clutches of Sheol, by taking me. Selah.

49:17 Do not be afraid when someone else becomes rich, when their household goods increase;

49:18 for when they die they can take none of it along; their goods cannot follow them down.

49:19 Though they congratulate themselves in their lifetime—“All must admit that you did well by yourself” All must admit that you did well by yourself Meaning of Heb. uncertain.—

49:21 Mortals do not understand honor; they are like the beasts that perish.

68:16 O majestic mountain, Mount Bashan;O jagged mountain, Mount Bashan;

68:17 why so hostile, O jagged mountains,toward the mountain God desired as a dwelling? GOD shall abide there forever.

68:18 God’s chariots are myriads upon myriads,thousands upon thousands;my Sovereign is among them as in Sinai in holiness.

68:19 You went up to the heights, having taken captives,having received tribute of people,even of those who rebelagainst the abiding there of Yah—who is God.

68:20 Blessed is my Sovereign,day by day supporting us—God, our deliverance. Selah.

68:21 God is for us a God of deliverance; GOD my Sovereign provides an escape from death.

68:22 God will smash the heads of all opponents,the hairy crown of the one who walks about in guilt.

68:23 My Sovereign said, “I will retrieve from Bashan,I will retrieve from the depths of the sea;

68:24 that your feet may wade through blood,that the tongue of your dogs may have its portion of your enemies.”

68:25 People see Your processions, O God,the processions of my God, my monarch,into the sanctuary.

68:26 First come singers, then musicians,amidst maidens playing hand-drums.cmaidens playing hand-drums See note at Exod. 15.20.

68:27 In assemblies bless God, ETERNAL One, O you who are from the fountain of Israel.

68:28 There is little Benjamin who rules them,the princes of Judah who command them,the princes of Zebulun and Naphtali.

68:29 Your God has ordained strength for you,the strength, O God,that You displayed for us

68:30 from Your temple above Jerusalem.The kings bring You tribute.

68:31 Blast the beast of the marsh,the herd of bulls among the peoples, the calves,till they come cringing with pieces of silver.Scatter the peoples who delight in wars!

68:32 Tribute-bearers shall come from Egypt;Cush shall hasten its gifts to God.

68:33 O kingdoms of the earth,sing to God;chant hymns to my Sovereign, selah

68:34 to the One who rides the ancient highest heavens,who thunders forth with a mighty voice.

68:35 Ascribe might to God, whose majesty is over Israel, whose might is in the skies.

68:36 You are awesome, O God, in Your holy places; it is the God of Israel who gives might and power to the people. Blessed is God.

69:1 For the leader. On shoshannim. ashoshannim Meaning of Heb. uncertain. Of David.

69:2 Deliver me, O God, for the waters have reached my neck;

69:3 I am sinking into the slimy deep and find no foothold; I have come into the watery depths; the flood sweeps me away.

69:4 I am weary with calling; my throat is dry; my eyes fail while I wait for God.

69:5 More numerous than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without reason; many are those who would destroy me, my treacherous enemies. Must I restore what I have not stolen?

69:6 God, You know my folly; my guilty deeds are not hidden from You.

69:7 Let those who look to You, O my Sovereign, GOD of hosts, not be disappointed on my account; let those who seek You, O God of Israel, not be shamed because of me.

69:8 It is for Your sake that I have been reviled, that shame covers my face;

69:9 I am a stranger to my kin, an alien to my own siblings.

69:10 My zeal for Your house has been my undoing; the reproaches of those who revile You have fallen upon me.

69:11 When I wept and fasted, I was reviled for it.

69:12 I made sackcloth my garment; I became a byword among them.

69:13 Those who sit in the gate talk about me; I am the taunt of drunkards.

69:14 As for me, may my prayer come to You, O ETERNAL One, at a favorable moment; O God, in Your abundant faithfulness, answer me with Your sure deliverance.

69:15 Rescue me from the mire; let me not sink; let me be rescued from my enemies, and from the watery depths.

69:16 Let the floodwaters not sweep me away; let the deep not swallow me; let the mouth of the Pit not close over me.

69:17 Answer me, O ETERNAL One, according to Your great steadfastness; in accordance with Your abundant mercy turn to me;

69:18 do not hide Your face from Your servant, for I am in distress; answer me quickly.

69:19 Come near to me and redeem me; free me from my enemies.

69:20 You know my reproach, my shame, my disgrace; You are aware of all my foes.

69:21 Reproach breaks my heart, I am in despair; in despair Meaning of Heb. uncertain. I hope for consolation, but there is none, for comforters, but find none.

69:22 They give me gall for food, vinegar to quench my thirst.

69:23 May their table be a trap for them, a snare for their allies.

69:24 May their eyes grow dim so that they cannot see; may their loins collapse continually.

69:25 Pour out Your wrath on them; may Your blazing anger overtake them;

69:26 may their encampments be desolate; may their tents stand empty.

69:27 For they persecute those You have struck; they talk about the pain of

those You have felled.

69:28 Add that to their guilt;let them have no share of Your beneficence;

69:29 may they be erased from the book of life,and not be inscribed with the righteous.

69:30 But I am lowly and in pain;Your help, O God, keeps me safe.

69:31 I will extol God's name with song,exultation, and praise.

69:32 That will please GOD more than oxen,than bulls with horns and hoofs.

69:33 The lowly will see and rejoice;you who are mindful of God, take heart!

69:34 For GOD listens to the needy,and does not spurn those held captive.

69:35 Heaven and earth shall sing praise,the seas, and all that moves in them.

69:36 For God will deliver Zionand rebuild the cities of Judah;they shall live there and inherit it;

69:37 the offspring of God's servants shall possess it;those who cherish God's name shall dwell there.

70:1 For the leader. Of David. Le hazkir. aLe hazkir Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

70:2 bCf. Ps. 40.14–18. Hasten, O God, to save me;O ETERNAL One, to aid me!

70:3 Let those who seek my lifebe frustrated and disgraced;let those who wish me harm,fall back in shame.

70:4 Let those who say, "Aha! Aha!"turn back because of their frustration.

70:5 But let all who seek You be glad and rejoice in You;let those who are eager for Your deliverance always say,"Extolled be God!"

70:6 But I am poor and needy;O God, hasten to me!You are my help and my rescuer;O ETERNAL One, do not delay.

71:1 I seek refuge in You, O ETERNAL One;may I never be disappointed.

71:2 As You are beneficent, save me and rescue me;incline Your ear to me and deliver me.

71:3 Be a sheltering rock for me to which I may always repair;decree my deliverance,for You are my rock and my fortress.

71:4 My God, rescue me from the hand of the wicked,from the grasp of the unjust and the lawless.

71:5 For You are my hope,O my Sovereign GOD,my trust from my youth.

71:6 While yet unborn, I depended on You;in the womb of my mother, You were my support;asupport Meaning of Heb. uncertain. I sing Your praises always.

71:7 I have become an example for many,since You are my mighty refuge.

71:8 My mouth is full of praise to You,glorifying You all day long.

71:9 Do not cast me off in old age;when my strength fails, do not forsake me!

71:10 For my enemies talk against me;those who wait for me are of one mind,

71:11 saying, "God has forsaken him;chase him and catch him,for no one will save him!"

71:12 O God, be not far from me;my God, hasten to my aid!

71:13 Let my accusers perish in frustration;let those who seek my ruin be clothed in reproach and disgrace!

71:14 As for me, I will hope always,and add to the many praises of You.

71:15 My mouth tells of Your beneficence,of Your deliverance all day long,though I know not how to tell it.

71:16 I come with praise of Your mighty acts, O my Sovereign GOD;I celebrate Your beneficence, Yours alone.

71:17 You have let me experience it, God, from my youth;until now I have proclaimed Your wondrous deeds,
71:18 and even in hoary old age do not forsake me, God,until I proclaim Your strength to the next generation,Your mighty acts, to all who are to come,

72:3 Let the mountains produce well-being for the people,the hills, the reward of justice.
72:4 Let him champion the lowly among the people,deliver the needy folk,and crush those who wrong them.
72:5 Let them fear You as long as the sun shines,while the moon lasts, generations on end.
72:6 Let him be like rain that falls on a mown field,like a downpour of rain on the ground,
72:7 that the righteous may flourish in his time,and well-being abound, till the moon is no more.
72:8 Let him rule from sea to sea,from the river to the ends of the earth.
72:9 Let desert-dwellers kneel before him,and his enemies lick the dust.
72:10 Let kings of Tarshish and the islands pay tribute,kings of Sheba and Seba offer gifts.
72:11 Let all kings bow to him,and all nations serve him.
72:12 For he saves the needy who cry out,the lowly who have no helper.
72:13 He cares about the poor and the needy;He brings the needy deliverance.
72:14 He redeems them from fraud and lawlessness;the shedding of their blood weighs heavily upon him.the shedding of their blood weighs heavily upon him Or "their life is precious in his sight."
72:15 So let him live, and receive gold of Sheba;let prayers for him be said always,blessings on him invoked at all times.
72:16 Let abundant grain be in the land, to the tops of the mountains;let his crops thrive like the forest of Lebanon;and let the people sprout up in towns like country grass.
72:17 May his name be eternal;while the sun lasts, may his name endure;bLet abundant grain ... endure Meaning of some Heb. phrases in these verses uncertain. let peoples invoke his blessedness upon themselves;let all nations count him happy.

72:18 Blessed is the ETERNAL God, God of Israel, who alone does wondrous things;
72:19 Blessed is God's glorious name forever; such glory fills the whole world. Amen and Amen.
72:20 End of the prayers of David son of Jesse.
73:1 A psalm of Asaph. God is truly good to Israel, to those whose heart is pure.
73:2 As for me, my feet had almost strayed, my steps were nearly led off course,
73:3 for I envied the wanton; I saw the wicked at ease.
73:4 Death has no pangs for them; their body is healthy.
73:5 They have no part in human travail; they are not afflicted like the rest of humankind.
73:6 So pride adorns their necks, lawlessness enwraps them as a mantle.
73:7 Fat shuts out their eyes; their fancies are extravagant. aFat ...
extravagant Meaning of Heb. uncertain.
73:8 They scoff and plan evil; from their eminence they plan wrongdoing.
73:9 They set their mouths against heaven, and their tongues range over the earth.
73:10 bMeaning of verse uncertain. So they pound this people again and again, until they are drained of their very last tear.
73:11 Then they say, "How could God know? Is there knowledge with the Most High?"
73:12 Such are the wicked; ever tranquil, they amass wealth.
73:13 It was for nothing that I kept my heart pure and washed my hands in innocence,
73:14 seeing that I have been constantly afflicted, that each morning brings new punishments.
73:15 Had I decided to say these things, I should have been false to the circle of Your disciples.
73:16 So I applied myself to understand this, but it seemed a hopeless task
73:17 till I entered God's sanctuary and reflected on their fate.
73:18 You surround them with flattery; You make them fall through blandishments.
73:19 How suddenly are they ruined, wholly swept away by terrors.
73:20 When You are aroused You despise their image, as one does a dream after waking, O my Sovereign.
73:21 My mind was stripped of its reason, my feelings were numbed. cmy feelings were numbed Lit. "I was pierced through in my kidneys."
73:22 I was a dolt, without knowledge; I was brutish toward You.
73:23 Yet I was always with You, You held my right hand;
73:24 You guided me by Your counsel and led me toward honor. dand led me toward honor Meaning of Heb. uncertain; in contrast to others "And afterward receive me with glory."
73:25 Whom else have I in heaven? And having You, I want no one on earth.
73:26 My body and mind fail; but God is the stay stay Lit. "rock." of my mind, my portion forever.
73:27 Those who keep far from You perish; You annihilate all who are untrue to You.
73:28 As for me, nearness to God is good; I have made the Sovereign GOD my refuge, that I may recount all Your works.

74:1 A maskil of Asaph. Why, O God, do You forever reject us, do You fume in anger at the flock that You tend?

74:2 Remember the community You made Yours long ago, Your very own tribe that You redeemed, Mount Zion, where You dwell.

74:3 Bestir Yourself a Bestir Yourself Lit. "Lift up Your feet." because of the perpetual tumult, bperpetual tumult Meaning of Heb. uncertain. all the outrages of the enemy in the sanctuary.

74:4 Your foes roar inside Your meeting-place; they take their signs for true signs.

74:5 It is like those who wield axes against a gnarled tree;

74:6 with hatchet and pick they hacked away at its carved work. cIt is like ... carved work Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

74:7 They made Your sanctuary go up in flames; they brought low in dishonor the dwelling-place of Your presence.

74:8 They resolved, "Let us destroy them altogether!" They burned all God's tabernacles in the land.

74:9 No signs appear for us; there is no longer any prophet; no one among us knows for how long.

74:10 Till when, O God, will the foe blaspheme, will the enemy forever revile Your name?

74:11 Why do You hold back Your hand, Your right hand? Draw it out of Your bosom! dDraw it out of Your bosom Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

74:12 O God, my Sovereign from of old, who brings deliverance throughout the land;

74:13 it was You who drove back the sea with Your might, who smashed the heads of the monsters in the waters;

74:14 it was You who crushed the heads of Leviathan, who left it as food for the denizens of the desert; e the denizens of the desert Or "seafaring peoples"; meaning of Heb. uncertain.

74:15 it was You who released springs and torrents, who made mighty rivers run dry;

74:16 the day is Yours, the night also; it was You who set in place the orb of the sun;

74:17 You fixed all the boundaries of the earth; summer and winter—You made them.

74:18 Be mindful of how the enemy blasphemes GOD, how base people revile Your name.

74:19 Do not deliver Your dove to the wild beast; do not ignore forever the band of Your lowly ones.

74:20 Look to the covenant! For the dark places of the land are full of the haunts of lawlessness.

74:21 Let not the downtrodden turn away disappointed; let the poor and needy praise Your name.

74:22 Rise, O God, champion Your cause; be mindful that You are blasphemed by scoundrels all day long.

74:23 Do not ignore the shouts of Your foes, the din of Your adversaries that ascends all the time.

75:1 For the leader; al tashheth. A psalm of Asaph, a song.

75:2 We praise You, O God; we praise You; Your presence is near; people tell of Your wondrous deeds.

75:3 “At the time I choose, I will give judgment equitably.

75:4 Earth and all its inhabitants dissolve; it is I who keep its pillars firm. Selah.

75:5 To the wanton I say, ‘Do not be wanton!’ to the wicked, ‘Do not lift up your horns!’”

75:6 Do not lift your horns up high in vainglorious bluster. ain vainglorious bluster Lit. “with arrogant neck you speak.”

75:7 For exaltation comes not from the east or from the west or the wilderness; wilderness Reading midbar (with qamas, not patah), as in many mss.

75:8 for God it is who gives judgment—bringing down one and lifting up another.

75:9 There is a cup in GOD’s hand with foaming wine fully mixed; from this [God] pours; all the wicked of the earth drink, draining it to the very dregs.

75:10 As for me, I will declare forever, I will sing a hymn to the God of Jacob.

75:11 “All the horns of the wicked I will cut; but the horns of the righteous shall be lifted up.”

76:1 For the leader; with instrumental music. A psalm of Asaph, a song.

76:2 God is known in Judah, God’s name is great in Israel;

76:3 Salem became an abode; Zion, the divine den.

76:4 There [God] broke the fiery arrows of the bow, the shield and the sword of war. Selah.

76:5 You were resplendent, glorious, on the mountains of prey.

76:6 The stout-hearted were despoiled; they were in a stupor; the bravest of soldiers could not lift a hand.

76:7 At Your blast, O God of Jacob, horse and chariot lay stunned.

76:8 O You! You are awesome! Who can withstand You when You are enraged?

76:9 In heaven You pronounced sentence; the earth was numbed with fright

76:10 as God rose to execute judgment, to deliver all the lowly of the earth. Selah.

76:11 a Meaning of verse uncertain. Even the fiercest among humans shall acknowledge You, when You gird on the last bit of fury.

76:12 Make vows and pay them to the ETERNAL your God; those all around shall bring tribute to the Awesome One—ball around ... Awesome One Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

76:13 who curbs the spirit of princes, inspires awe in the kings of the earth.

77:1 For the leader; on Jeduthun. Of Asaph. A psalm.

77:2 I cry aloud to God; I cry to God that I may be heard.

77:3 In my time of distress I turn to my Sovereign, with my hand [uplifted]; [my eyes] flow all night without respite; with my hand ... without respite Meaning of Heb. uncertain. I will not be comforted.

77:4 I call God to mind, I moan, I complain, my spirit fails. Selah.

77:5 You have held my eyelids open; I am overwrought, I cannot speak.

77:6 My thoughts turn to days of old, to years long past.

77:7 I recall at night their jibes at me;I commune with myself;my spirit inquires,

77:8 “Will my Sovereign reject foreverand never again show favor?

77:9 Has such faithfulness disappeared forever?Will those promises be unfulfilled for all time?

77:10 Has God forgotten how to pity?Has God’s compassion been stifled in anger?” Selah.

77:11 And I said, “It is my faultthat the right hand of the Most High has changed.”bIt is my fault / ... changed Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

77:12 I recall the deeds of Yah;cYah See note at 68.5. yes, I recall Your wonders of old;

77:13 I recount all Your works;I speak of Your acts.

77:14 O God, Your ways are holiness;what god is as great as God?

77:15 You are the God who works wonders;You have manifested Your strength among the peoples.

77:16 By Your arm You redeemed Your people,the children of Jacob and Joseph. Selah.

77:17 The waters saw You, O God,the waters saw You and were convulsed;the very deep quaked as well.

77:18 Clouds streamed water;the heavens rumbled;Your arrows flew about;

77:19 Your thunder rumbled like wheels;lightning lit up the world;the earth quaked and trembled.

77:20 Your way was through the sea,Your path, through the mighty waters;Your tracks could not be seen.

77:21 You led Your people like a flockin the care of Moses and Aaron.

78:1 A maskil of Asaph.Give ear, my people, to my teaching,turn your ear to what I say.

78:2 I will expound a theme,hold forth on the lessons of the past—

78:3 things we have heard and known,that our ancestors have told us.

78:4 We will not withhold them from their children,telling the coming generationthe praises of GOD and of divine might,and the wonders performed.

78:5 [God] established a decree in Jacob,ordained a teaching in Israel,charging our ancestorsto make them known to their children,

78:6 that a future generation might know—children yet to be born—and in turn tell their children

78:7 that they might put their confidence in God,and not forget God’s great deeds,but observe the commandments,

78:8 and not be like their ancestors,a wayward and defiant generation,a generation whose heart was inconstant,whose spirit was not true to God.

78:9 Like the Ephraimite archerswho played false in the day of battle,

78:10 they did not keep God’s covenant,they refused to follow divine instruction;

78:11 they forgot what was done for themand the wonders they were shown.

78:12 [God] performed marvels in the sight of their ancestors,in the land of Egypt, the plain of Zoan.

78:13 [God] split the sea and took them through it—making the waters stand like a wall.

78:14 [God] led them with a cloud by day, and throughout the night by the light of fire.

78:15 [God] split rocks in the wilderness and gave them drink as if from the great deep.

78:16 [God] brought forth streams from a rock and made them flow down like a river.

78:17 But they went on sinning, defying the Most High in the parched land.

78:18 To test God was in their mind when they demanded food for themselves.

78:19 They spoke against God, saying, "Can God spread a feast in the wilderness?"

78:20 True, [God] a [God] I.e., Moses, acting as God's agent; cf. Exod.

17.5–6. struck the rock and waters flowed, streams gushed forth; but can [God] provide bread and supply meat for this people?"

78:21 GOD heard and then raged; fire broke out against Jacob, anger flared up at Israel,

78:22 because they did not put their trust in God, did not rely on divine deliverance.

78:23 So [God] commanded the skies above, opened the doors of heaven

78:24 and rained manna upon them for food, giving them heavenly grain.

78:25 Each person ate a hero's meal; they were sent provision in plenty.

78:26 [God] set the east wind moving in heaven, and drove the south wind mightily.

78:27 [God] rained meat on them like dust, winged birds like the sands of the sea,

78:28 making them come down inside God's camp, around the divine dwelling-place.

78:29 They ate till they were sated; they were given what they craved.

78:30 They had not yet wearied of what they craved, the food was still in their mouths

78:31 when God's anger flared up at them. [God] slew their sturdiest, struck down the youth of Israel.

78:32 Nonetheless, they went on sinning and had no faith in God's wonders.

78:33 Their days were made to end in futility, their years in sudden death.

78:34 When stricken, bstricken Lit. "killed." they returned, and sought God once again.

78:35 They remembered that God was their rock, God Most High, their Redeemer.

78:36 Yet they deceived [God] with their speech, and lied with their words.

78:37 Their hearts were inconstant; they were untrue to the covenant.

78:38 But [God], being merciful, forgave iniquity and would not destroy—restraining wrath time and again and not giving full vent to such fury—

78:39 remembering that they were but flesh, a passing breath that does not return.

78:40 How often did they act defiantly in the wilderness, then cause grief in the wasteland!

78:41 Again and again they tested God, vexed or vexed Or "set a limit to." the Holy One of Israel.

78:42 They did not remember God's strength, or the day they were redeemed from the foe;

78:43 how [God] displayed signs in Egypt, and wonders in the plain of Zoan.

78:44 [God first] turned their rivers into blood—making their waters undrinkable;

78:45 then inflicted upon them swarms of insects to devour them, frogs to destroy them;

78:46 then gave their crops over to grubs, their produce to locusts;

78:47 then killed their vines with hail, their sycamores with frost; dwith frost
Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

78:48 then gave their beasts over to hail, their cattle to lightning bolts;

78:49 and inflicted a burning anger upon them—wrath, indignation, trouble, a band of deadly messengers.

78:50 [God] cleared a path for that anger, and did not stop short of slaying them, but gave them over to pestilence.

78:51 [God] struck every [male] first-born in Egypt, the first fruits of their vigor in the tents of Ham.

78:52 God's own people were set moving like sheep, driven like a flock in the wilderness.

78:53 [God] led them in safety; they were unafraid; as for their enemies, the sea covered them.

78:54 [God] brought them to the holy realm, erealm Or "hill" with Septuagint and Saadia. the mountain God's right hand had acquired.

78:55 [God] expelled nations before them, settled the tribes of Israel in their tents, allotting them their portion by the line. fsettled the tribes of Israel in their tents, / allotting them their portion by the line Clauses transposed for clarity.

78:56 Yet they defiantly tested God Most High, and did not observe divine decrees.

78:57 They fell away, disloyal like their ancestors; they played false like a treacherous bow.

78:58 They provoked anger with their high places; they kindled wrath with their idols.

78:59 God heard it and was enraged—utterly rejecting Israel.

78:60 [God] forsook the tabernacle of Shiloh, the tent that had been set among mortals.

78:61 God's might God's might I.e., the Ark; cf. Ps. 132.8. was allowed to go into captivity, that glory into the hands of the foe.

78:62 This people was given over to the sword; God's very own the object of rage.

78:63 Fire consumed their young men, and their maidens remained unwed. hremained unwed Lit. "had no nuptial song."

78:64 Their priests fell by the sword, and their widows could not weep.

78:65 The Sovereign awoke as from sleep—like a warrior shaking off fishaking off Meaning of Heb. uncertain. wine—

78:66 and beat back all foes, dealing them lasting disgrace.

78:67 [God] rejected the clan of Joseph and did not choose the tribe of Ephraim.

78:68 [God] did choose the tribe of Judah—Mount Zion, which was beloved—
78:69 building the Sanctuary like the heavens,like the earth that [God]
established forever.

78:70 David, God’s servant, was chosen,and taken from the sheepfolds.

78:71 He was brought from minding the nursing ewesto tend the people of Jacob,
Israel, God’s very own.

78:72 He tended them with blameless heart;with skillful hands he led them.

79:1 A psalm of Asaph.O God, heathens have entered Your domain,defiled Your
holy temple,and turned Jerusalem into ruins.

79:2 They have left Your servants’ corpsesas food for the fowl of heaven,and
the flesh of Your faithful for the wild beasts.

79:3 Their blood was shed like water around Jerusalem,with none to bury them.

79:4 We have become the butt of our neighbors,the scorn and derision of those
around us.

79:5 How long, O ETERNAL One, will You be angry forever,will Your indignation
blaze like fire?

79:6 Pour out Your fury on the nations that do not know You,upon the kingdoms
that do not invoke Your name,

80:20 O ETERNAL One, God of hosts, restore us;show Your favor that we may be
delivered.

81:3 Take up the song,sound the hand-drum,the melodious lyre and harp.

81:5 For it is a law for Israel,a ruling of the God of Jacob—
81:6 imposed as a decree upon Josephwhen he went forth fromahe went forth from
Or "[God] went forth against." the land of Egypt;I heard a language that I
knew not.
81:7 "I relieved his shoulder of the burden,his hands were freed from the
basket.
81:8 In distress you called and I rescued you;I answered you from the secret
place of thundersecret place of thunder Meaning of Heb. uncertain. I tested
you at the Waters of Meribah. Selah.
81:9 Hear, My people, and I will admonish you;Israel, if you would but listen
to Me!
81:10 You shall have no foreign god,you shall not bow to an alien god.
81:11 I the ETERNAL am your Godwho brought you out of the land of Egypt;open
your mouth wide and I will fill it.
81:12 But My people would not listen to Me,Israel would not obey Me.
81:13 So I let them go after their willful heartthat they might follow their
own devices.
81:14 If only My people would listen to Me,if Israel would follow My paths,
81:15 then would I subdue their enemies at once,strike their foes again and
again."
81:16 Those who hate GOD shall cower;their doom shall be eternal.
81:17 [God] fed IsraelcIsrael Heb. "him." the finest wheat;"I sated you
with honey from the rock."

82:1 A psalm of Asaph.God stands in the divine assembly,pronouncing judgment
among the divine beings.
82:2 How long will you judge perversely,showing favor to the wicked? Selah.
82:3 Judge the wretched and the orphan,vindicate the lowly and the poor,
82:4 rescue the wretched and the needy;save them from the hand of the wicked.
82:5 They neither know nor understand,they go about in darkness;all the
foundations of the earth totter.

82:6 I had taken you for divine beings, attendants attendants Lit. "sons."
of the Most High, all of you;

82:7 but you shall die as mortals do, fall like any prince.

82:8 Arise, O God, judge the earth, for all the nations are Your possession.

83:1 A song, a psalm of Asaph.

83:2 O God, do not be silent; do not hold aloof; do not be quiet, O God!

83:3 For Your enemies rage, Your foes assert themselves. assert themselves Lit.
"lift up the head."

83:4 They plot craftily against Your people, take counsel against Your treasured
ones.

83:5 They say, "Let us wipe them out as a nation; Israel's name will be
mentioned no more."

83:6 Unanimous in their counsel they have made an alliance against You—

83:7 the clans of Edom and the Ishmaelites, Moab and the Hagrites,
83:8 Gebal, Ammon, and Amalek, Philistia with the inhabitants of Tyre;
83:9 Assyria too joins forces with them; they give support to the descendants of
Lot. the descendants of Lot i.e., the Moabites and the Ammonites; cf. Gen.
19.36–38. Selah.

83:10 Deal with them as You did with Midian, with Sisera, with Jabin, at the
brook Kishon—

83:11 who were destroyed at En-dor, who became dung for the field.

83:12 Treat their nobles like Oreb and Zeeb, all their princes like Zebah and
Zalmunna,

83:13 who said, "Let us take the meadows of God as our possession."

83:14 O my God, make them like thistle down, like stubble driven by the wind.

83:15 As a fire burns a forest, as flames scorch the hills,
83:16 pursue them with Your tempest, terrify them with Your storm.

83:17 Cover Cover Lit. "Fill." their faces with shame so that they seek Your
name, O ETERNAL One.

83:18 May they be frustrated and terrified, disgraced and doomed forever.

83:19 May they know that Your name, Yours alone, is GOD, supreme over all the
earth.

84:1 For the leader; on the gittith. Of the Korahites. A psalm.

84:2 How lovely is Your dwelling-place, O GOD of Hosts.

84:3 I long, I yearn for the courts of the ETERNAL One; my body and soul shout
for joy to the living God.

84:4 Even the sparrow has found a home, and the swallow a nest for herself in
which to set her young, near Your altar, O GOD of Hosts, my monarch and my God.

84:5 Happy are those who dwell in Your house; they forever praise You. Selah.

84:6 Happy are those who find refuge in You, whose mind is on the [pilgrim]
highways.

84:7 They pass through the Valley of Baca, regarding it as a place of springs, as
if the early rain had covered it with blessing. regarding it ... blessing
Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

84:8 They go from rampart to rampart, brampart to rampart In contrast to others
"strength to strength." appearing before God in Zion.

84:9 O ETERNAL God of hosts, hear my prayer; give ear, O God of Jacob. Selah.

84:10 O God, behold our shield, look upon the face of Your anointed.

84:11 Better one day in Your courts than a thousand [anywhere else]; I would rather stand at the threshold of God's house than dwell in the tents of the wicked.

84:12 For the ETERNAL God is sun or "bulwark," with Targum; cf. Isa. 54:12. and shield; GOD bestows grace and glory, and does not withhold bounty from those who live without blame.

84:13 O GOD of Hosts, happy is the one who trusts in You.

85:1 For the leader. Of the Korahites. A psalm.

85:2 O ETERNAL One, You will favor will favor Or "have favored." Your land, restore restore Or "have restored." Jacob's fortune;

85:3 You will forgive will forgive Or "have forgiven." Your people's iniquity, pardon pardon Or "have pardoned." all their sins; selah

85:4 You will withdraw will withdraw Or "have withdrawn." all Your anger, turn turn Or "have turned." away from Your rage.

86:2 Preserve my life, for I am steadfast; O You, my God, deliver Your servant who trusts in You.

86:3 Have mercy on me, O my Sovereign, for I call to You all day long;

86:4 bring joy to Your servant's life, for on You, my Sovereign, I set my hope.

86:5 For You, my Sovereign, are good and forgiving, abounding in steadfast love to all who call on You.

86:6 Give ear, O ETERNAL One, to my prayer; heed my plea for mercy.

86:7 In my time of trouble I call You, for You will answer me.

86:8 There is none like You among the gods, O my Sovereign, and there are no deeds like Yours.

86:9 All the nations You have made will come to bow down before You, O my Sovereign, and they will pay honor to Your name.

86:10 For You are great and perform wonders; You alone are God.

86:11 Teach me Your way, O ETERNAL One; I will walk in Your truth; let my heart be undivided in reverence for Your name.

86:16 Turn to me and have mercy on me; grant Your strength to Your servant and deliver the son of Your maidservant.

86:17 Show me a sign of Your favor, that my enemies may see and be frustrated because You, O ETERNAL One, have given me aid and comfort.

87:5 Indeed, it shall be said of Zion, "They dThey I.e., the nations of v. 4, or their members. were all born there." It is the Most High who will preserve it. eIt is the Most High who will preserve it Or "[God] will preserve it supreme."

87:6 GOD will inscribe in the register of people that each was born there. Selah.

87:7 Singers and dancers alike [will say]: "All my roots froots Lit. "sources." are in You."

88:1 A song. A psalm of the Korahites. For the leader; mahalath leannoth. amahalath leannoth Meaning of Heb. uncertain. A maskil of Heman the Ezrahite.

88:2 O ETERNAL One, God of my deliverance, when I cry out in the night bwhen I cry out in the night Or "by day I cry out [and] by night." before You,

88:3 let my prayer reach You; incline Your ear to my cry.

88:4 For I am sated with misfortune; I am at the brink of Sheol.

88:5 I am numbered with those who go down to the Pit; I am like someone helpless clike someone helpless Or "like a virile man who is helpless."

88:6 abandoned dabandoned Lit. "released." among the dead, like bodies lying in the grave eof whom You are mindful no more, and who are cut off from Your care.

88:7 You have put me at the bottom of the Pit, in the darkest places, in the depths.

88:8 Your fury lies heavy upon me; You afflict me with all Your breakers. Selah.

88:9 You make my companions shun me; You make me abhorrent to them; I am shut in and do not go out.

88:10 My eyes pine away from affliction; I call to You, O ETERNAL One, each day; I stretch out my hands to You.

88:11 Do You work wonders for the dead? Do the shades rise to praise You? Selah.

88:12 Is Your faithful care recounted in the grave, Your constancy in the place of perdition?

88:13 Are Your wonders made known in the netherworld, enetherworld Lit. "darkness." Your beneficent deeds in the land of oblivion?

88:14 As for me, I cry out to You, O ETERNAL One; each morning my prayer greets You.

88:15 Why, O ETERNAL One, do You reject me, do You hide Your face from me?

88:16 From my youth I have been afflicted and near death; I suffer Your terrors wherever I turn. f. wherever I turn Following Saadia; meaning of Heb. uncertain.

88:17 Your fury overwhelms me; Your terrors destroy me.

88:18 They swirl about me like water all day long; they encircle me on every side.

88:19 You have put friend and neighbor far from me and my companions out of my sight. g. out of my sight Lit. "into darkness."

89:1 A maskil of Ethan the Ezrahite.

89:2 I will sing of GOD's steadfast love forever; to all generations I will proclaim Your faithfulness with my mouth.

89:3 I declare, "Your steadfast love is confirmed forever; there in the heavens You establish Your faithfulness."

89:4 "I have made a covenant with My chosen one; I have sworn to My servant David:

89:5 I will establish your offspring forever, I will confirm your throne for all generations." Selah.

89:6 Your wonders, O ETERNAL One, are praised by the heavens, Your faithfulness, too, in the assembly of holy beings.

89:7 For who in the skies can equal GOD, can compare with GOD among the divine beings,

89:8 a God greatly dreaded in the council of holy beings, held in awe by those all around?

89:9 O ETERNAL One, God of hosts, who is mighty like You, O Yah? a Yah See note at 68.5. Your faithfulness surrounds You;

89:10 You rule the swelling of the sea; when its waves surge, You still them.

89:11 You crushed Rahab; he was like a corpse; with Your powerful arm You scattered Your enemies.

89:12 The heaven is Yours, the earth too; the world and all it holds—You established them.

89:13 North and south—You created them; Tabor and Hermon sing forth Your name.

89:14 Yours is an arm endowed with might; Your hand is strong; Your right hand, exalted.

89:15 Righteousness and justice are the base of Your throne; steadfast love and faithfulness stand before You.

89:16 Happy is the people who know the joyful shout; O ETERNAL One, they walk in the light of Your presence.

89:17 They rejoice in Your name all day long; they are exalted through Your righteousness.

89:18 For You are their strength in which they glory; our horn is exalted through Your favor.

89:19 Truly our shield is of GOD, our monarch, of the Holy One of Israel.

89:20 Then b. Then Referring to vv. 4–5; cf. 2 Sam. 7.1–17. You spoke to Your

faithful ones in a vision and said, "I have conferred power upon a warrior; I have exalted one chosen out of the people.

89:21 I have found David, My servant; anointed him with My sacred oil.

89:22 My hand shall be constantly with him, and My arm shall strengthen him.

89:23 No enemy shall oppress him, oppress him Meaning of Heb. uncertain. no one vile afflict him.

89:24 I will crush his adversaries before him; I will strike down those who hate him.

89:37 His line shall continue forever, his throne, as the sun before Me,

89:38 as the moon, established forever, an enduring witness in the sky." Selah.

89:39 Yet You have rejected, spurned, and become enraged at Your anointed.

89:40 You have repudiated the covenant with Your servant; You have dragged his dignity in the dust.

89:41 You have breached all his defenses, shattered his strongholds.

89:42 All who pass by plunder him; he has become the butt of his neighbors.

89:43 You have exalted the right hand of his adversaries, and made all his enemies rejoice.

89:44 You have turned back the blade of his sword, and have not sustained him in battle.

89:45 You have brought his splendor, his splendor Meaning of Heb. uncertain. to an end and have hurled his throne to the ground.

89:46 You have cut short the days of his youth; You have covered him with shame. Selah.

89:47 How long, O ETERNAL One; will You forever hide Your face, will Your fury blaze like fire?

89:48 O remember how short my life is; how short my life is Meaning of Heb.

uncertain. why should You have created every person in vain?

89:49 Who? Or “What virile man.” can live and not see death, can escape the clutches of Sheol? Selah.

89:50 O my Sovereign, where is Your steadfast love of old that You swore to David in Your faithfulness?

89:51 Remember, O my Sovereign, the abuse flung at Your servants that I have borne in my bosom [from] many peoples, that I have borne in my bosom [from] many peoples. Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

89:52 how Your enemies, O ETERNAL One, have flung abuse, abuse at Your anointed at every step.

89:53 Blessed is GOD forever; Amen and Amen.

90:1 A prayer of Moses, the agent of God. O my Sovereign, You have been our refuge in every generation.

90:2 Before the mountains came into being, before You brought forth the earth and the world, from eternity to eternity You are God.

90:3 You return humans to dust; dust. Or “contrition.” You decreed, “Return, you mortals!”

90:4 For in Your sight a thousand years are like yesterday that has passed, like a watch of the night.

90:5 You engulf mortals. Heb. “them.” in sleep; For in Your sight ... sleep. Meaning of Heb. uncertain. at daybreak they are like grass that renews itself;

90:6 at daybreak it flourishes anew; by dusk it withers and dries up.

90:7 So we are consumed by Your anger, terror-struck by Your fury.

90:8 You have set our iniquities before You, our hidden sins in the light of Your face.

90:9 All our days pass away in Your wrath; we spend our years like a sigh.

90:10 The span of our life is seventy years, or, given the strength, eighty years; but the best of them, the best of them. Meaning of Heb. uncertain. are trouble and sorrow. They pass by speedily, and we are in darkness. Or “fly away.”

90:11 Who can know Your furious anger? Your wrath matches the fear of You.

90:12 Teach us to count our days rightly, that we may obtain a wise heart.

90:13 Turn, O ETERNAL One! How long? Show mercy to Your servants.

90:14 Satisfy us at daybreak with Your steadfast love that we may sing for joy all our days.

90:15 Give us joy for as long as You have afflicted us, for the years we have suffered misfortune.

90:16 Let Your deeds be seen by Your servants, Your glory by their children.

90:17 May the favor of my Sovereign, our God, be upon us; let the work of our hands prosper, O prosper the work of our hands!

91:1 O you who dwell in the shelter of the Most High and abide in the protection of Shaddai—

91:2 I say of GOD, my refuge and stronghold, my God in whom I trust,

91:3 that you will be saved from the fowler’s trap, from the destructive plague.

91:4 With pinions you will be covered; you will find refuge under God’s

wings—whose fidelity is an encircling shield.

91:5 You need not fear the terror by night,or the arrow that flies by day,

91:6 the plague that stalks in the darkness,or the scourge that ravages at noon.

91:10 no harm will befall you,no disease touch your tent.

91:11 For God’s angels will be orderedto guard you wherever you go.

91:12 They will carry you in their handslest you hurt your foot on a stone.

91:13 You will tread on cubs and vipers;you will trample lions and asps.

91:14 “Because such people are devoted to Me, I will deliver them;I will keep them safe, for they know My name.

91:15 When they call on Me, I will answer them;I will be with them in distress;I will rescue them and make them honored;

91:16 I will let them live to a ripe old age,and show them My salvation.”

92:1 A psalm. A song; for the sabbath day.

92:2 It is good to praise GOD,to sing hymns to Your name, O Most High,

92:3 To proclaim Your steadfast love at daybreak,Your faithfulness each night

92:4 With a ten-stringed harp,with voice and lyre together.

92:5 You have gladdened me by Your deeds, O ETERNAL One;I shout for joy at Your handiwork.

92:6 How great are Your works, O ETERNAL One,how very subtleasubtle Or “profound.” Your designs!

92:7 A brute cannot know,a fool cannot understand this:

92:8 though the wicked sprout like grass,though all evildoers blossom,it is only that they may be destroyed forever.

92:9 But You are exalted, O ETERNAL One, for all time.

92:10 Surely, Your enemies, O ETERNAL One,surely, Your enemies perish;all evildoers are scattered.

92:11 You raise my horn high like that of a wild ox;I am soaked in freshening oil.

92:12 I shall see the defeat of my watchful foes,hear of the downfall of the wicked who beset me.

92:13 The righteous bloom like a date-palm;they thrive like a cedar in Lebanon;

92:14 planted in the house of GOD,they flourish in the courts of our God.

92:15 In old age they still produce fruit;they are full of sap and freshness—

92:16 attesting that GOD is upright,my rock, in whom there is no wrong.

93:1 GOD is sovereign,and robed in grandeur; GOD is robed,and girded with strength.The world stands firm;it cannot be shaken.

93:2 Your throne stands firm from of old;from eternity You have existed.

93:3 The ocean sounds, O ETERNAL One,the ocean sounds its thunder,the ocean sounds its pounding.

93:4 Above the thunder of the mighty waters,more majestic than the breakers of the seas GOD, majestic on high.

93:5 Your decrees are indeed enduring;holiness befits Your house,O ETERNAL One, for all times.

94:1 God of retribution, ETERNAL One,God of retribution, appear!

94:2 Rise up, judge of the earth,give the arrogant their deserts!

94:3 How long shall the wicked, O ETERNAL One,how long shall the wicked exult,

94:4 shall they utter insolent speech,shall all evildoers vaunt themselves?

94:5 They crush Your people, O ETERNAL One,they afflict Your very own;

94:6 they kill the widow and the stranger;they murder the fatherless,

94:7 thinking, “YahaYah See note at 68.5. does not see it,the God of Jacob does not pay heed.”

94:8 Take heed, you most brutish people;fools, when will you get wisdom?

94:9 Shall the One who implants the ear not hear,the One who forms the eye not see?

94:10 Shall the One who disciplines nations not punish,the One who instructs humankind in knowledge?

94:11 GOD knows human designs to be futile.

94:12 Happy are thosebare those Or “is the virile man.” whom You discipline, O Yah,whom You instruct in Your teaching,

94:13 whom You give tranquility in times of misfortune,until a pit be dug for the wicked.

94:14 For GOD will not forsake this people;God’s very own will not be abandoned.

94:15 Judgment shall again accord with justiceand all the upright shall rally to it.

94:16 Who will take my part against evildoers?Who will stand up for me against wrongdoers?

94:17 Were not GOD my help,I should soon dwell in silence.

94:18 When I think my foot has given way,Your faithfulness, O ETERNAL One, supports me.

94:19 When I am filled with cares,Your assurance soothes my soul.

94:20 Shall the seat of injustice be Your partner,that frames mischief by statute?

94:21 They band together to do away with the righteous;they condemn the innocent to death.

94:22 But GOD is my haven;my God is my sheltering rock.

94:23 Their evil will be made to recoil upon them,through their own wickedness they will be annihilated; the ETERNAL our God will annihilate them.

95:1 Come, let us sing joyously to GOD,raise a shout for our rock and deliverer;

95:2 let us come into the divine presence with praise;let us shout out in song!

95:3 For the ETERNAL is a great God,the great ruler of all divine beings.

95:4 In God’s hand are the depths of the earth;the peaks of the mountains are God’s.

95:5 The sea is God’s—the One who made it;and the land, fashioned by God’s hands.

95:6 Come, let us bow down and kneel,bend the knee before the ETERNAL our maker,

95:7 for this One is our God, and we are the people being cared for—the tended flock. O, if you would but heed God’s charge this day:

95:8 Do not be stubborn as at Meribah, as on the day of Massah, in the wilderness,

95:9 when your ancestors put Me to the test, tried Me, though they had seen My deeds.

95:10 Forty years I was provoked by that generation; I thought, “They are a senseless people; they would not know My ways.”

95:11 Concerning them I swore in anger, “They shall never come to My resting-place!”

96:5 All the gods of the peoples are mere idols, but the ETERNAL made the heavens.

96:6 Glory and majesty are present; strength and splendor are in the holy temple.

96:7 Ascribe to GOD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to GOD glory and strength.

104:16 The trees of the ETERNAL drink their fill, the cedars of Lebanon, God's own planting,

104:17 where birds make their nests; the stork has her home in the junipers.

104:18 The high mountains are for wild goats; the crags are a refuge for rock-badgers.

104:19 [God] made the moon to mark the seasons; the sun knows when to set.

104:20 You bring on darkness and it is night, when all the beasts of the forests stir.

104:21 The lions roar for prey, seeking their food from God.

104:22 When the sun rises, they come home and couch in their dens.

104:23 People then go out to their work, to their labor until the evening.

104:24 How many are the things You have made, O ETERNAL One; You have made them all with wisdom; the earth is full of Your creations.

104:25 There is the sea, vast and wide, with its creatures beyond number, living things, small and great.

104:26 There go the ships, and Leviathan that You formed to sport with.

104:27 All of them look to You to give them their food when it is due.

104:28 Give it to them, they gather it up; open Your hand, they are well satisfied;

104:29 hide Your face, they are terrified;take away their breath, they
perishand turn again into dust;
104:30 send back Your breath, they are created,and You renew the face of the
earth.
104:31 May GOD's glory endure forever;may GOD rejoice in these works!
104:32 —The One who looks at the earth and it trembles,touches the mountains
and they smoke.
104:33 I will sing to the ETERNAL as long as I live;all my life I will chant
hymns to my God.
104:34 May my prayer be found pleasing;I will rejoice in GOD.
104:35 May sinners disappear from the earth,and the wicked be no more.Bless
Yah,dYah See note at 68.5. O my soul.Hallelujah.
105:1 Praise GOD;call on this name;proclaim God's deeds among the peoples.
105:2 Sing out praises;speack of all those wondrous acts.
105:3 Exult in this holy name;let all who seek GOD rejoice.
105:4 Turn to GOD, to divine might;adivine might I.e., the Ark; cf. Ps. 78.61;
132.8. seek God's presence constantly.
105:5 Remember the wonders that have been done,the portents, and judgments
pronounced,
105:6 O offspring of Abraham, God's servant,O descendants of Jacob, the
chosen ones.
105:7 The ETERNAL is our God,whose judgments are throughout the earth.
105:8 [God] is ever mindful of the covenant,the promise given for a thousand
generations,
105:9 that was made with Abraham,sworn to Isaac,
105:10 and confirmed in a decree for Jacob,for Israel, as an eternal covenant,
105:11 saying, "To you I will give the land of Canaan your allotted
heritage."
105:12 They were then few in number,a mere handful, sojourning there,
105:13 wandering from nation to nation,from one kingdom to another.
105:14 None were allowed to oppress them;kings were reprovod on their account,
105:15 "Do not touch My anointed ones;do not harm My prophets."
105:16 A famine was called down on the land,destroying every staff of bread.
105:17 [God] sent ahead of them an agent—Joseph, sold into slavery.
105:18 His feet were subjected to fetters;an iron collar was put on his neck.
105:19 Until his prediction came true GOD's decree purged him.
105:20 The king sent to have him freed;the ruler of nations released him.
105:21 He made him the lord of his household,empowered him over all his
possessions,
105:22 to discipline his princes at will,to teach his elders wisdom.
105:23 Then Israel came to Egypt;Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.
105:24 [God] made that people very fruitful,more numerous than their foes,
105:25 then changed the heartbchanged the heart Or "Their heart changed."
[of the Egyptians] to hate this people,to plot against God's servants.
105:26 Moses—God's servant—was sent,and Aaron, who had been chosen.
105:27 They performed God's signs among them,and wonders, against the land of
Ham.

105:28 [God] sent darkness; it was very dark; did they not defy God's word? did they not defy God's word Meaning of Heb. uncertain.

105:29 Their waters were turned into blood and their fish were killed.

105:30 Their land teemed with frogs, even the rooms of their king.

105:31 Swarms of insects came at God's command, lice, throughout their country.

105:32 They were given hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land.

105:33 Their vines and fig trees were struck, the trees of their country broken down.

105:34 Locusts came at God's command, grasshoppers without number.

105:35 They devoured every green thing in the land; they consumed the produce of the soil.

105:36 [God] struck down every [male] first-born in the land, the first fruit of their vigor.

105:37 Israel Israel Heb. "them." was led out with silver and gold; none among their tribes faltered.

105:38 Egypt rejoiced when they left, for dread of Israel Israel Heb. "them." had fallen upon them.

105:39 [God] spread a cloud for a cover, and fire to light up the night.

105:40 They asked, and were brought quail, and were satisfied with food from heaven.

105:41 [God] opened a rock so that water gushed forth; it flowed as a stream in the parched land.

105:42 Mindful of the sacred promise to Abraham—God's servant,

105:43 The people were led out in gladness, God's chosen ones with joyous song.

105:44 They were given the lands of nations; they inherited the wealth of peoples,

105:45 that they might keep God's laws and observe God's teachings. Hallelujah.

106:1 Hallelujah. Praise GOD, who is good—whose steadfast love is eternal.

106:2 Who can tell GOD's mighty acts, proclaim all due praises?

106:3 Happy are those who act justly, who do right at all times.

106:4 Be mindful of me, O ETERNAL One, when You favor Your people; take note of me when You deliver them,

106:5 that I may enjoy the prosperity of Your chosen ones, share the joy of Your nation, glory in Your very own people.

106:6 We have sinned like our ancestors; we have gone astray, done evil.

106:7 Our ancestors in Egypt did not perceive Your wonders; they did not remember Your abundant love, but rebelled at the sea, at the Sea of Reeds.

106:8 Yet they were saved, as befits God's name, to make known God's might.

106:9 A blast was sent against the Sea of Reeds; it became dry; they were led through the deep as through a wilderness.

106:10 They were delivered from the foe, redeemed from the enemy.

106:11 Water covered their adversaries; not one of them was left.

106:12 Then they believed God's promise, and sang God's praises.

106:13 But they soon forgot those deeds; they would not wait to learn the divine

plan.

106:14 They were seized with craving in the wilderness, and put God to the test in the wasteland.

106:15 They were given what they asked for, then made to waste away.

106:16 There was envy of Moses in the camp, and of Aaron, GOD's holy one.

106:17 The earth opened up and swallowed Dathan, closed over the party of Abiram.

106:18 A fire blazed among their party, a flame that consumed the wicked.

106:19 They made a calf at Horeb and bowed down to a molten image.

106:20 They exchanged their glory for the image of a bull that feeds on grass.

106:21 They forgot God who saved them, who performed great deeds in Egypt,

106:22 wondrous deeds in the land of Ham, awesome deeds at the Sea of Reeds.

106:23 They would have been destroyed had not Moses, God's chosen one, stood in the breach to avert God's destructive wrath.

106:24 They rejected the desirable land, and put no faith in the divine promise.

106:25 They grumbled in their tents and disobeyed GOD.

106:26 So a divine hand was raised in oath to make them fall in the wilderness,

106:27 to disperse and scatter Cf. Targum, Kimhi. their offspring among the nations and scatter them through the lands.

106:28 They attached themselves to Baal Peor, ate sacrifices offered to the dead.

106:29 They provoked anger by their deeds, and a plague broke out among them.

106:30 Phinehas stepped forth and intervened, and the plague ceased.

106:31 It was reckoned to his merit for all generations, to eternity.

106:32 They provoked wrath at the waters of Meribah and Moses suffered on their account,

106:33 because they rebelled against [God] and he spoke rashly.

106:34 They did not destroy the nations as GOD had commanded them,

106:35 but mingled with the nations and learned their ways.

106:36 They worshiped their idols, which became a snare for them.

106:37 Their own sons and daughters they sacrificed to demons.

106:38 They shed innocent blood, the blood of their sons and daughters, whom they sacrificed to the idols of Canaan; so the land was polluted with bloodguilt.

106:39 Thus they became defiled by their acts, debauched through their deeds.

106:40 GOD was angry with this people and abhorred them as an inheritance.

106:41 They were handed over to the nations; their foes ruled them.

106:42 Their enemies oppressed them and they were subject to their power.

106:43 They were saved time and again, but they were deliberately rebellious, and so they were brought low by their iniquity.

106:44 Upon seeing that they were in distress, and hearing their cry,

106:45 [God] was mindful of the covenant and in great faithfulness relented.

106:46 Their captors were made to be kindly disposed toward them.

106:47 Deliver us, our ETERNAL God, and gather us from among the nations, to acclaim Your holy name, to glory in Your praise.

106:48 Blessed is the ETERNAL, God of Israel, From eternity to eternity. Let all the people say, "Amen." Hallelujah.

107:1 "Praise GOD, who is good—whose steadfast love is eternal!"

107:2 Thus let GOD's redeemed say,those redeemed from adversity,
107:3 who have been gathered in from the lands,from east and west,from the north and from the sea.

107:9 for satisfying the thirsty,and filling the hungry with all good things.
107:10 Some lived in deepest darkness,bound in cruel irons,
107:11 because they defied the word of God,spurned the counsel of the Most High.
107:12 Their hearts were humbled through suffering;they stumbled with no one to help.
107:13 In their adversity they cried to GOD,and were rescued from their troubles.
107:14 They were brought out of deepest darkness,their bonds broken asunder.
107:15 Let them give praise for GOD's steadfast loveand wondrous deeds for humankind—
107:16 shattering gates of bronze,breaking their iron bars.
107:17 There were fools who suffered for their sinful way,and for their iniquities.
107:18 All food was loathsome to them;they reached the gates of death.
107:19 In their adversity they cried to GOD and they were saved from their troubles.
107:20 [God] gave an order and healed them—delivering them from the pits.athe pits Of death.
107:21 Let them give praise for GOD's steadfast loveand wondrous deeds for humankind.
107:22 Let them offer thanksgiving sacrifices,and tell those deeds in joyful song.
107:23 Others go down to the sea in ships,ply their trade in the mighty waters;
107:24 they have seen GOD's worksand such wonders in the deep.
107:25 God's word raised a storm windthat made the waves surge.
107:26 Mounting up to the heaven,plunging down to the depths,disgorging in their misery,
107:27 they reeled and staggered like a drunk,all their skill to no avail.
107:28 In their adversity they cried to GOD,and were saved from their troubles.
107:29 The storm was reduced to a whisper;the waves were stilled.
107:30 They rejoiced when all was quiet,and were brought to the port they desired.
107:31 Let them give praise for GOD's steadfast love,and wondrous deeds for humankind.
107:32 Let them exalt in the congregation of the people,acclaim in the assembly

of the elders.

107:33 The rivers are turned into a wilderness, springs of water into thirsty land,

107:34 fruitful land into a salt marsh, because of the wickedness of its inhabitants.

107:35 The wilderness is turned into pools, parched land into springs of water.

107:36 There the hungry are settled; they build a place to settle in.

107:37 They sow fields and plant vineyards that yield a fruitful harvest.

107:38 They are blessed and they increase greatly—their cattle do not decrease,

107:39 after they had been few and crushed by oppression, misery, and sorrow.

107:40 [God] pours contempt on nobles and makes them lose their way in trackless deserts;

107:41 but the needy are secured from suffering, their families increased like flocks.

107:42 The upright see it and rejoice; the mouth of all wrongdoers is stopped.

107:43 One who is wise will take note of these things and consider GOD's steadfast love.

108:1 A song. A psalm of David.

108:2 aCf. Ps. 57.8–12. My heart is firm, O God; I will sing and chant a hymn with all my soul.

108:3 Awake, O harp and lyre! I will wake the dawn.

108:4 I will praise You among the peoples, O ETERNAL One, sing a hymn to You among the nations;

108:5 for Your faithfulness is higher than the heavens; Your steadfastness reaches to the sky.

148:12 youths and maidens alike,old and young together.

148:13 Let them praise GOD’s name—for sublime is this name alone—of the One whose splendor covers heaven and earth.

148:14 [God] has exalted the horn of this peoplefor the glory of all faithful ones,Israel, the people brought close.Hallelujah.

149:1 Hallelujah.Sing to GOD a new song,sing praises in the congregation of the faithful.

149:2 Let Israel rejoice in its maker;let the children of Zion exult in their monarch.

149:3 Let them praise God’s name in dance;with hand-drum and lyre let them chant such praises.

149:4 For GOD delights in this people,and adorns the lowly with victory.

149:5 Let the faithful exult in glory;let them shout for joy upon their couches,

149:6 with paeans to God in their throatsand two-edged swords in their hands,

149:7 to impose retribution upon the nations,punishment upon the peoples,

149:8 binding their kings with shackles,their nobles with chains of iron,

149:9 executing the doom decreed against them.This is the glory of all the faithful.Hallelujah.

150:1 Hallelujah.Give praise in the divine sanctuary;give praise in the sky,

the divine stronghold.

150:2 Give praise for mighty acts; give praise for a force Or “as befits.”
exceeding greatness.

150:3 Give praise with blasts of the horn; give praise with harp and lyre.

150:4 Give praise with hand-drum and dance; give praise with lute and pipe.

150:5 Give praise with resounding cymbals; give praise with loud-clashing
cymbals.

150:6 Let all that breathes praise Yah. bYah See note at 68.5. Hallelujah.

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
